

## Balloon, Coming Soon



### Superintendent's Message Dr. David Daigneault

This month, I had the privilege of hosting the Grenada School District Board of Trustees for a sneak preview of an exciting new facility we're developing at the Grenada Armory.

Expanding our district's previous success with innovative and hands-on learning, we're creating an interactive museum for GSD students in grades 3-8. We're calling it Balloon Quest.

When students visit the armory, a portion of which will be dedicated to this story-driven learning experience, they will choose among various scientist teams and embark on a simulated hot-air balloon journey across various ecosystems. (In case you've driven by the armory at night and wondered why there were hot-air balloons in the front windows, now you have a clue.) The exhibit's immersive environments combine elements of an escape room, a science lab, and an interactive museum.

This new exhibit is a natural progression from two of our district's most successful programs, Grenada Elementary's Kidzeum and the 4-5 building's Discovery Lab. Those programs are popular because they give students the opportunity to put their classroom lessons into action with hands-on activities and experiments.

Balloon Quest will introduce key concepts in science, language, history, math, and engineering. Students must apply their knowledge in order to advance through the diverse landscapes. The story takes them from Grenada across the United States and beyond. We believe our unique concept will increase student comprehension and problem-solving skills, while stimulating their imagination and developing a sense of environmental awareness.

As one of Mississippi's premier Districts of Innovation, GSD is always looking for ways to invigorate our instruction and enhance the students' comprehension of state-based educational standards.

We've watched our state accountability scores rise as we implement more activities that simultaneously challenge and entertain students. In addition to the Kidzeum and the Discovery Lab, games and interactive challenges have become an effective way of teaching. Teachers at the elementary schools have reported success with escape room scenarios, where kids solve curriculum-based challenges in order to "escape" or move on to the next challenge. At the middle school, science teachers introduce concepts in physics and engineering before assigning project-based tasks in which students build their own designs -- whether it's robots or roller coasters -- using these principles.

At the January meeting of the Grenada School District Board of Trustees, Kevin Carnathan was sworn in as the new board president. Carnathan fills the seat previously held by outgoing president Brent Brasher.

Also sworn in at the January meeting was Haley Biddy, the board's newest member, who ran unopposed in District Five last November.

Biddy, a lifelong resident of Grenada, sells farm equipment and supplies for Nutrien Ag Solutions. He currently serves as president of the Farm Bureau Federation board in Grenada County.

Biddy said he first considered running for a seat on the GSD board a few years

ago. "I appreciate the shape our school district is in and the direction it's going," he said. "I just want to maintain that success and build on it."

Biddy said he finds the district's greatest strengths in its quality teachers and administrators. He was especially complimentary of the PreK through fifth grade schools, which are providing a solid foundation for the kids of Grenada County.

"It starts with teachers," Biddy said. "The influence of a good teacher at a young age will make a student strong throughout their years in school."

The Biddy family has been well-represented at Grenada School District for many years. Haley's father, Bobby Biddy, is a renowned carpenter with the district's maintenance department, and his sister, Kim Graves, is a counselor at GES

PreK-3.

Haley's grandfather, Brigadier General James Harold Biddy, served as a member of the GSD Board of Trustees from 1965 to 1976. He was instrumental in planning for the Grenada National Guard Armory to be turned over to the school district when operations were completed. The building was relinquished to the school in 2017. It currently houses the high school's NNDCC/ROTC program, and is the future site of Balloon Quest, an interactive student science museum. (See Superintendent's Message, this page.)

Biddy is married to another lifelong Grenada resident, Laura Rounsaville Biddy. They have one son, Bowden, a 7th grader at Grenada Middle School.

I was always told, ‘No one can ever take it away once you get it and understand it.’ I have enjoyed tutoring and mentoring kids and letting them know that I believe in them.”

Wilks graduated from Grenada High School, received an associate degree from Holmes Community College, and received a bachelor’s degree from the University Of Mississippi. She was well-poised to succeed in this position. She was an active member of the National Honor Society at GHS and Phi Kappa



Phi at Ole Miss, where she participated in community service. She has also served at Bethel Cathedral of Faith, Grenada County Family and Children’s Services, and Montgomery County Family and Children’s Services. She has three sons: Reginald Barton, Deontae Barton, and Carsten McCaley.

“AmeriCorps is a great program, and I am honored to serve,” Wilks said. “I have been empowered to build my

resume and to network more. I have even expanded my skills that are related to my field of study, social work. It is an honor to give back to the community in which I have lived all of my life. I have a greater appreciation for the Grenada School District and see the value of what we are doing for the children of the future.”

As an AmeriCorps team leader, Wilks is responsible for reflecting the spirit of AmeriCorps and mentoring her team members in their service roles. She also serves as a liaison between the director and site supervisor.

Wilks overcame personal challenges with the attitude of consistency, perseverance, and whole-hearted determination. She is motivated and purpose-driven and believes that with a positive mindset and staying focused, she can accomplish her dreams.

She is currently enrolled in Hollywood Barber School, where she is pursuing her dream of becoming a licensed barber/stylist within a few months. 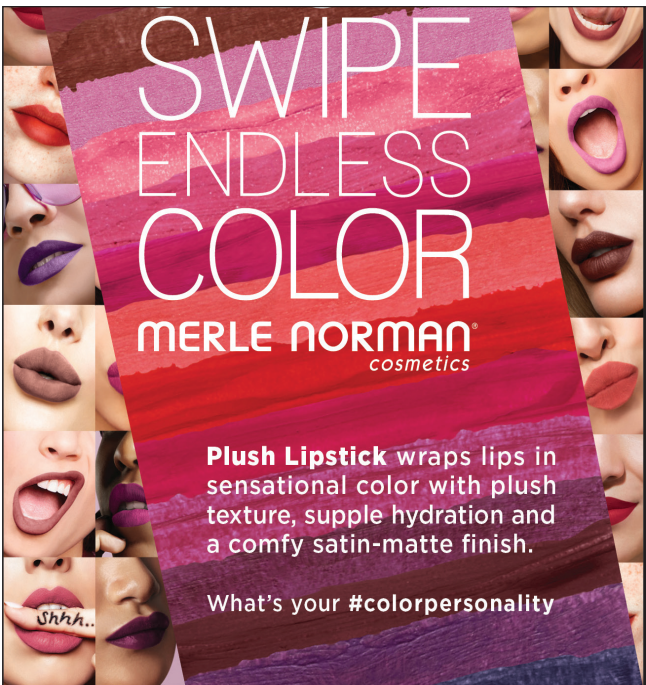

Grenada School District students and staff are collaborating on a community project, the Free Little Library.

Free Little Library is a growing movement throughout the world, providing access to books in areas that are underserved by bookstores and libraries.

The local Free Little Library is a ser-

vice project conducted by the Alpha Phi Chapter of Delta Kappa Gamma International, a women's educational organization serving Carroll, Montgomery and Grenada counties.

Grenada Middle School counselor Laura Byrd, president of the chapter, said she first saw the Free Little Library on a trip to Savannah, Georgia.

The idea is to create a secure place for anyone in the community to take, borrow, or leave a book. It's an all-hours

library with no check-in or check-out and no late fees. It works on the honor system and unites community members through a love of reading.

Byrd has conducted the project with two colleagues at GMS, counselor Ashley Harrell and librarian Natalie Trammell. They enlisted the help of Lamar Pitcock, building trades instructor at the Grenada Career and Technical Center, who tasked his students with building the box where the books will be housed.

The Free Little Library is awaiting

installation on the Grenada downtown square. Byrd said it should be up and running by Spring Break.

Grenada joins more than 90,000 Free Little Libraries in over 90 countries.
