

## **River of Light Lantern Walk**

We will be holding our 3<sup>rd</sup> Annual River of Light at WRVS on February 22, 2023. It is a celebration of kindness and peace for our community. Many communities around the world gather together in solidarity and parade with light to celebrate this human quality that is so important to the well-being of us all.

The parade will begin at 6:00PM. Scholars, families, and community members, please plan to arrive at WRVS prior to 5:45PM. Please note the parking lot will be closed after that time so we can safely begin our parade at 6:00pm.

Each scholar is participating in creating a lantern. K-2 scholars are building a half-sphere lantern with papier mache, 3-5 scholars are making rectangular prisms with parchment paper and watercolors, and 6-8 scholars are constructing spheres with reed and papier mache, as well as some of their own 3D sculptural lanterns designs.

Families and community members are invited to create a lantern using one of the methods listed above. More information to follow.
