appy New Year to all. We hope that all of our students, families and staff had a nice winter break. To date, we have received more snow this year than we have seen in the past 30 years in Faribault. Thank you to our students, families and staff for working through the inconvenience that school closures and e-learning days can cause.

Kindergarten registration is now open for the fall. We know that deciding where to send your child to school is a huge decision; we hope you consider Faribault Public Schools. All three of our elementary schools will be hosting open houses in March. Please feel free to call our main office line and schedule a tour at any time.

High School registration is right around the corner. We invite you to check out our registration guide (found on the high school website) to see all that we have to offer.

At the beginning of this school year, we conducted a School Climate and Culture survey of students, families and staff. Although there are some areas in which we can improve, overall we saw very positive results. 81% of Faribault Public Schools students feel a sense of belonging in their school and 87% of students feel that the staff in their school treat them with respect. Additionally, 89% of parents feel that FPS staff truly care about their child and 91% feel welcome in their child's school. When asked about their physical and emotional well-being, 97% of staff reported that they feel safe in their school.

We remain committed to having high expectations for every student and empowering them to reach their full

potential. Our passion and dedication to the growth of every single student, parent, and community member is why families choose the Faribault Public School District.

Teddy Bear Day for Preschool Students


