

Therefore, our expectation is that students and families make every effort to attend school regularly, arrive on time, schedule personal and medical appointments after school hours and avoid taking family vacations when school is in session. If your child is going to be absent, please leave a message on the Attendance HotLine before 9 am at 203-341-1699.

A student is considered to be "in attendance" if present at school for at least half of the regular school day (4 hours minimum at Middle School). Absences from school beyond 9 days will require a doctor's note to be considered excused. Students attending school for less than four (4) hours on any given school day are recorded as absent. "Truant" is defined as any student age five (5) to eighteen (18) years of age, inclusive, who has four (4) unexcused absences from school in any one month or ten (10) unexcused absences from school in any school year. Attendance is checked daily; parents and guardians will be notified when your child is absent from school and you have access to the student's daily attendance through the PowerSchool Parent Portal.


