Headlice and nits



FIRST HISTORY AND POLITICS CONFERENCE

On Tuesday, we welcomed Dr Marc Morris to Millfield Prep School who delivered a talk to Year 7 in the Recital Hall. This is an annual event at the Senior School, but this year, both history departments wanted to stage the History and Politics Conference across both schools over the course of a single day. This was an excellent opportunity for our pupils to hear from an expert on 1066 and the Norman Conquest, a topic that they have all recently studied a matter of weeks ago. Furthermore, it allowed our pupils to listen and learn about what happened during and after the Battle of Hastings and to ask questions about Norman history. Our guest commented on the quality of questions asked and the enthusiasm of the pupils, which was lovely to hear. We were also able to invite Millfield students and staff to the Conference and some being ex-Millfield Prep pupils themselves, who really enjoyed the opportunity to return back to the school and be involved in the morning talk.

We were also very fortunate to arrange a Q&A workshop with a group of Year 8 pupils, which focused on the process of writing history and how to evaluate evidence. I asked the pupils to prepare a selection of questions to ask Dr Morris and this certainly helped them to lead the workshop. They learnt about everything from what makes well written history, to what historians do if there is a limited amount of evidence available. This led to a superb exchange of ideas and was a brilliant way to learn about history from a published historian. I would like to thank all the staff involved in planning the conference and again, congratulate all the pupils for their excellent engagement throughout the morning. We intend to develop more academic enrichment in the future and work with our colleagues at Millfield to offer more events of this kind.













FOOD STUDIES

This week in food studies, the Year 3 pupils enjoyed creating crumpet pizzas and were challenged to use a grill for the first time.

Each pupil identified a problem from a set brief, designed their own idea, calculated what materials they needed and then constructed their own bespoke projects. YOUNG VOICES

Young Voices is one of the most looked forward to dates in the school calendar and this year was no different. On Friday, we had the pleasure of taking 70 pupils from Years 4 – 6 to Resorts World Arena in Birmingham, the most we've ever taken. 




FLEXI-BOARDING

MESSAGE FROM MR JORY
