What is Running Start?

Running Start is a partnership with Lakes Region Community College (LRCC) where students can take a high school course approved by LRCC and earn dual high school and college credit. In most instances this college credit CAN be transferred to a student's final destination college.

Running Start courses offered at ILMHS second semester include; Statistics, Introduction to Business, Marketing, Pre-Calculus and Web Design

To participate in *Running Start* students MUST Sign up by February 20th.




NH Elks

Camp fee eligibility

\$750 eligible: Students with a disability

\$600 eligible: Students from families earning less than 250% of the federal poverty level **\$450 eligible:** Students from families earning less than 400% of the federal poverty level




