Reading

Math

In math, we are focusing upon learning the vocabulary, symbols, and strategies in order to solve word problems and numerical problems within 10 for addition and subtraction.

<u>Writing</u>

In writing, we are writing true stories about things we know.

Math:

We will continue to explore all the ways to subtract. We will be using those strategies to help us solve subtraction number sentences and word problems. February marks our celebration of the 100th Day of school. We will be counting and sorting numbers to 100.

<u>Writing:</u>

We will continue to work in our nonfiction unit as we write more "All About Books". We will be sharing all we know and teaching our readers all about our favorite topics using content specific vocabulary and illustrations.

Fundations:

Students continue to learn new reading and spelling patterns in one-syllable words. We are working with words made up of four sounds that contain consonant blends, combined with all previous skills learned. Students are also being exposed to r-controlled vowel sounds, vowel teams and alued sounds.

Social Studies:

This month our first graders will discuss Black History Month, President's Day, the Lunar New Year and Groundhog's Day.

Science:

We are switching gears from Mystery Science to explore in our Lego Lab. We will be starting our First Lego League Superpowered challenges. First Lego League introduces STEM(Science, Technology, Engineering and Math) through fun, exciting hands-on learning. Our first graders will develop critical-thinking and presentation skills, build habits of learning and self-confidence, and have a ton of fun while working as part of a team.

Health:

Our first grade students continue to learn about safety. Students will be learning about how they can think ahead to get places safely. It is important to plan a safe way for how you will go somewhere, such as to school or home. Students will also take part in the Stony Brook Dental Health Program and learn how important it is to keep their teeth healthy.

<u>Reading:</u>

We are continuing to work in our nonfiction unit, "Learning About the World by Reading". Students are learning how to get themselves ready to read an informational book, they are becoming better at figuring out new and important vocabulary words that relate to specific topics, and they are studying informational books more closely to learn as much information as they can from the pictures, features, and words.



2nd Grade February News



Reading

In reader's workshop, students will continue to study characters. We will keep learning new character trait vocabulary words and look for examples in our books to support our thinking.

Science

We began a new unit in Mystery
Science: Work of Water. Students
are exploring the concepts of
weathering and erosion, how sand is
formed at the beach, where rivers
begin and end, and the effect of
water on land. It is a very exciting
and interesting unit!

Writing

In writer's workshop, students are writing letters about books to special people in their lives. They are sharing their opinions about books and supporting their ideas with evidence and examples from the text.

Math

Students will be making a big shift in math. So far, we have focused on addition from basic facts through triple-digit addition. Now, we will dive deep into subtraction, strengthening our knowledge of basic facts, and moving into double-digit subtraction.

<u>Social Studies</u>

In social studies, students are studying geography. We are learning about landforms, continents, oceans, bodies of water, and thinking about how where we live can affect the community we come from.



3rd Grade February News

Social Studies:

We will continue our studies of continents, oceans and landforms.

Reading:

We will be launching our Mystery unit. Students will explore a variety of mystery books and may even experience a real mystery in their classrooms! Please support at least 20 minutes of independent reading each night at home.



Science:

We will continue our work on how animals and their environment change through time.



Writing:


We will be creating persuasive writing pieces based on a topic that we feel strongly about. Students will support their opinions with strong supporting details in hopes of persuading others.

Math:

We will be working on division and how it relates to multiplication. We will continue flashcard practice as well as our Math Madness Competition (Multiplication facts up to and including 12).

4th Grade February News





Math:

We will be continuing our unit on division, using multiple strategies. Students will learn how to divide with area models, distributive property, and partial quotients. Then, we will begin our unit on comparing fractions and equivalent fractions.

Health:

During this month we will be discussing how to resolve conflict in healthy ways.

<u>Writing:</u>

We will be finishing our persuasive writing unit and going into our next unit called "Literary Essay." In this unit, students will make claims about characters and support their claims with evidence from the text.

<u>Reading:</u>


We will be finishing our non-fiction research unit and going into our next unit called "Detail and Synthesis." In this unit, students will learn close reading strategies for fiction, to help them grow deeper theories about characters, track themes across stories, and compare and contrast themes across texts.

Science:

We will be continuing our LEGO unit on renewable energy. Students will learn to build and code with LEGO® Education WeDo 2.0 to power a model of a wind turbine, energy storage model, and carousel. They will also create a team model based on their own energy journey. During the process they will explore, create, test, and share their ideas.

Social Studies:

Our students will be learning about famous explorers, including Henry Hudson, Samuel de Champlain, and Giovanni da Verrazzano, who have impacted the geography of New York State through exploration and discovery. Then, we will be learning about how the 13 British colonies were formed and what life was like during that time.



MUSIC



Kindergarten-3rd Grade: Kindergarten and 1st grade students will be making music related to the themes of snow, mittens, and Valentines Day. This month they will read through the song the Mitten by Jan Brett, and add instruments that enhance the story. Students will learn about Ella Fitzgerald, and her songs in a Valentines Day lesson. Students will move like Peter in a Snowy Day, and outline his movements on the glockenspiel.

2nd and 3rd grade students will learn a Snowflake rhythm chant. They are learning how to play ostinatos on the instruments. Students will begin reading notes and matching them to the classroom instrument pitches.

4th Grade:

4th grade students are working together to compose music to the book "The Great Kapok Tree" by Lynn Cherry. In small groups students will read the story while performing on instruments of their choice. They will work together to compose various rhythms and melodies to make the story come alive with music.

Band: Students in the band are beginning to learn their concert music pieces. Full band rehearsals will begin after the February break on March 1st. All students should bring their instruments in every Wednesday in addition to their lesson day.




Art

What's happening in Primary Physical Education?



LIBRARY



KINDERGARTEN and FIRST GRADE

In February, Kindergarteners will explore the most magical section of the library: fairy tales! We will start by reading James Marshall's *The Three Little Pigs*, and then dive right into the exciting world of fractured fairy tales. We will read Sue Fliess's *Goldilocks & the Three Engineers*, Mo Willems' *Goldilocks & the Three Dinosaurs*, and Helen Lester's *Tackylocks & the Three Bears*. Throughout this unit, students will be comparing each of these stories to the original and thinking of what was similar and what was different each time. We will discuss these similarities and differences together as a class and think about the core elements found in each of these stories.

In First Grade, we will wrap up our globe-trotting *Little Polar Bear* unit and begin a new unit on biographies. Lars the Little Polar Bear took us on a journey around the world; we visited places like West Africa, Siberia, and of course the North Pole! In our new biography unit, we have the opportunity to meet new people and still visit new (and maybe familiar) places. Students will learn where to find biographies in our school library, what biographies are, and be introduced to some very special people through stories such as *Snowflake Bentley*, *Finding Winnie*, and more!

During February, 2nd grade will be introduced to the Caldecott Medal. Our 4th grade students will finishing up their weather research. In addition, they will be learning about plagiarism and copyright and how they can avoid plagiarizing. They will use this knowledge to create the citations for their weather research project. Our 4th grade students will then start their unit on Digital Citizenship. They will be discussing what it means to be a good digital citizen, and the difference between personal and private information

In February, our kindergarteners will finish up our Mo Willems author study. At this point of our Author Study, we will be focusing on Elephant and Piggie, Edwina: the dinosaur who didn't know she was extinct, and Goldilocks and the Three Dinosaurs. We will be discussing how the illustrations were made, are the books fiction or nonfiction, and doing fun activities related to these books.

Our first graders will take the first steps in becoming independent browsers. They will learn how to use the shelf markers when looking for books. We will discuss how to use the shelf makers and why we use shelf markers in the library. They will also be finishing up their Jan Brett author study during which we have been focusing on the different story elements-setting, character, and problem and solution.
