

Science News


In Ms. Jefferson's Class, 8th graders participated in the Living Environment's State Lab - Beaks of Finches. Students learned how structural differences of the beaks of the bird affected their survival rate. Each student was given 1 of 4 beaks - pliers, tweezers, chopsticks and clothespins. The students used their 'beaks' to pick up small seeds in the first round. If they didn't 'eat' 13 or more seeds they would be moved to an island with bigger seeds. They then competed with other birds. The students overall had a fun learning experience.

7th Graders created a Placemat about the *Circulatory System*. Each person was given a different colored marker. They created a graphic organizer with circulatory system in the center. Each person had to answer one question - What is it? What are its parts? etc. They watched a video to help answer the questions.













Math News

Ms. Tata's 6th grade class was learning how to solve one step equations using algebra tiles. This hands-on approach kept the scholars engaged and allowed them to conceptually understand how to solve a one-step equation.

Each scholar cut out their own set of manipulatives where they modeled each problem using zero pairs and the inverse property of operations, to keep both sides of the equation balanced. This met the needs of all students! Who said algebra can't be fun?!


Congrats to the 5th Grade Students for having the highest Attendance Rate for the month of December!
