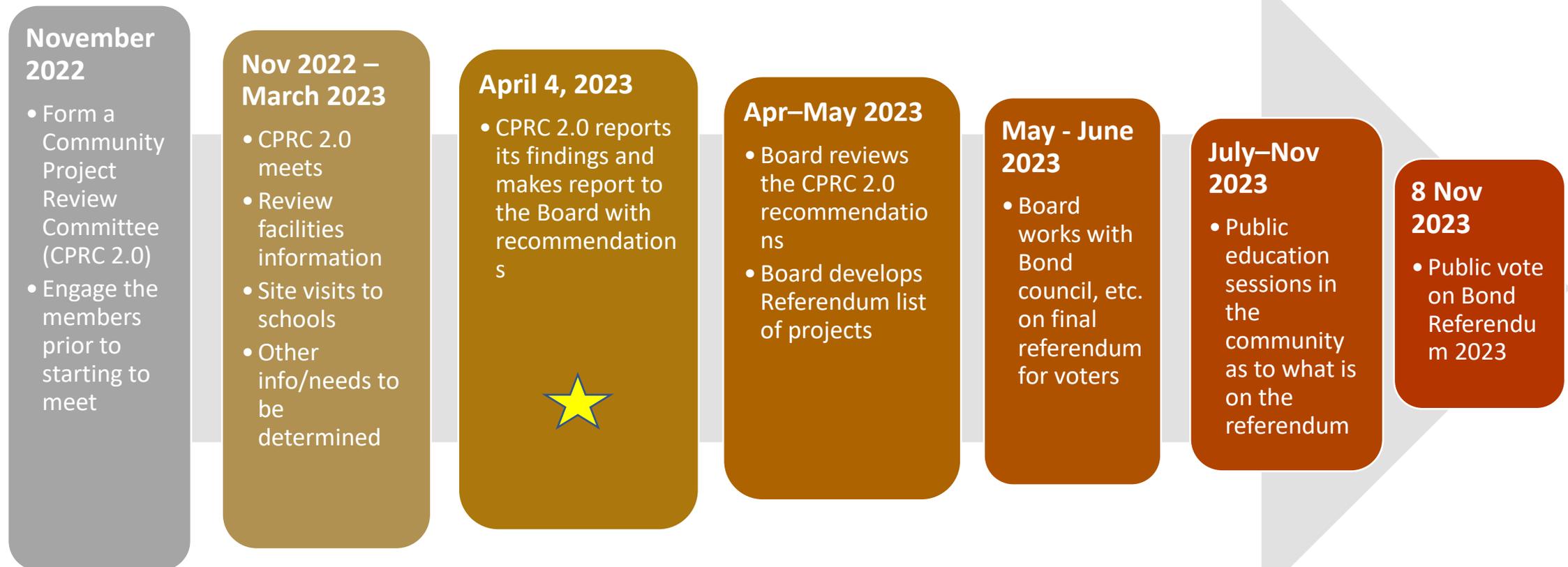

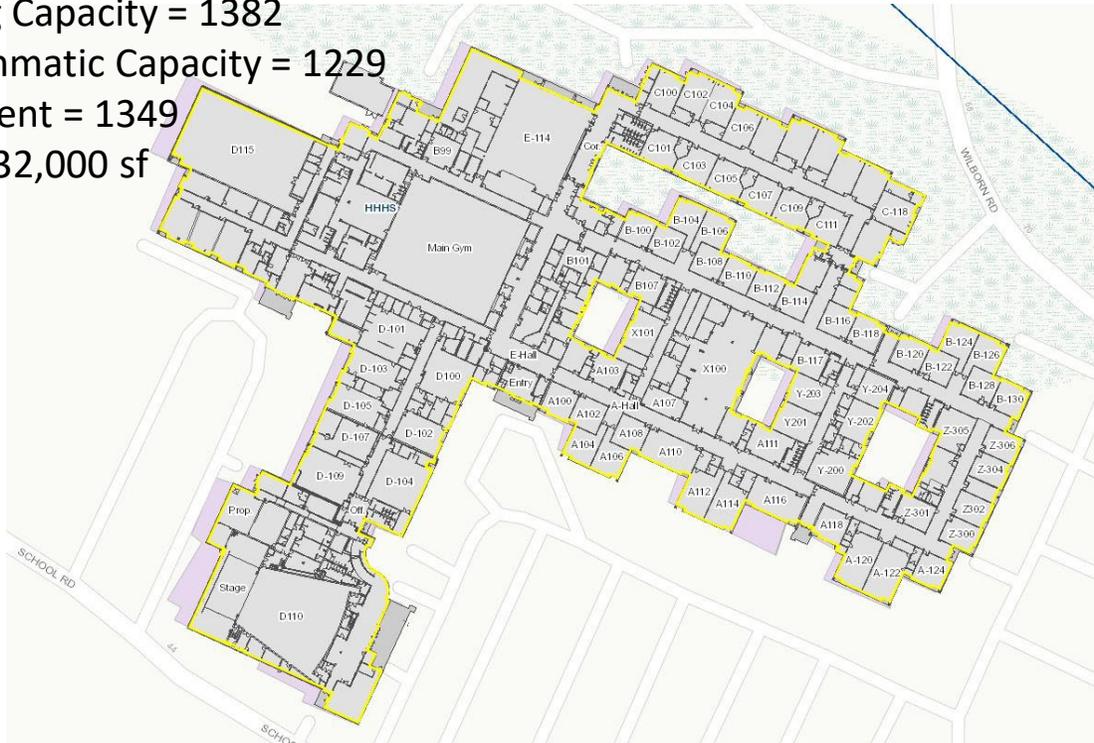
Reasons to Rebuild Hilton Head Island High School

1. Supervision & Safety/Security
2. Teaching and Learning
3. Cost to Replace versus Renovate

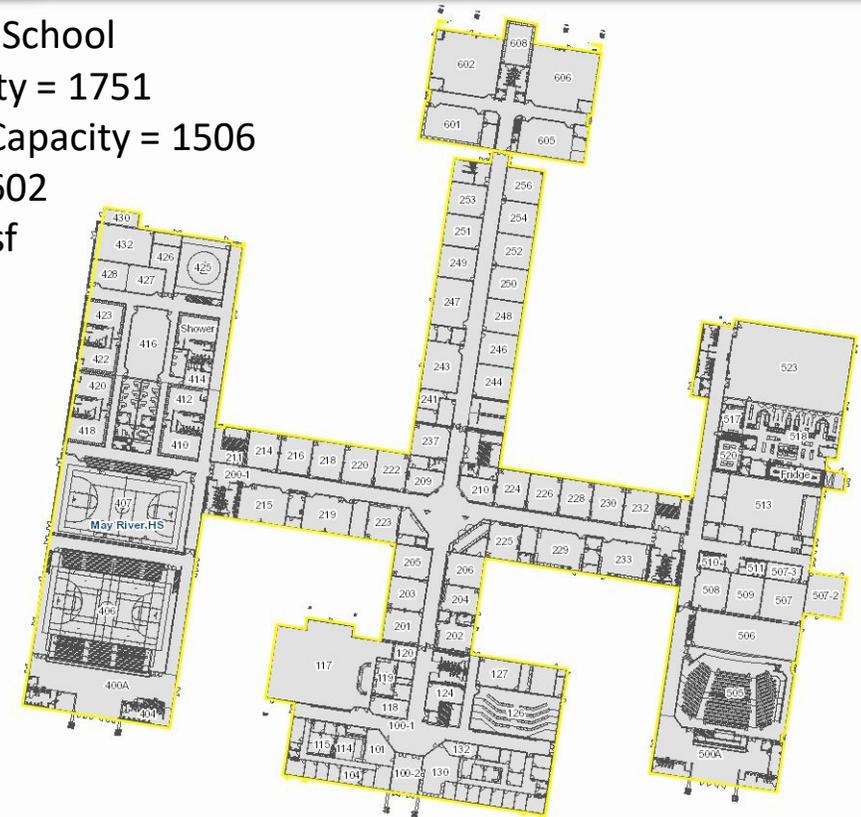


Hilton Head High School
Building Capacity = 1382
Programmatic Capacity = 1229
Enrollment = 1349
Size = 232,000 sf



100% Supervision of all main hallways & courtyards
18 staff members

May River High School
Building Capacity = 1751
Programmatic Capacity = 1506
Enrollment = 1602
Size = 281,331 sf



100% Supervision of all main hallways
14 staff members

4. 2019 Hilton Head Island High Facilities Assessment



Cost to Renovate vs. Rebuild

1. Renovation

1. \$53 Million = 2019 Cost to Renovate HHHS including classroom expansion addition and CTE addition

2. \$72 Million = 2023 Cost to Renovate

2. \$120 Million = Estimated cost to Rebuild = Approximately 150,000 sf new and 100,000 sf renovated

3. Capacities would be similar

4. Renovation cost = 60% of Rebuild

1. Supervision & Safety/Security
2. Teaching and Learning
3. Right Size Building
4. Cost to Replace versus Renovate

Lady's Island Middle School
Building Capacity = 1088
Programmatic Capacity = 801
Enrollment = 434
Size = 144,226 sf



Exterior Doors
66= Exterior Doors excluding pods
95 = Exterior Doors including pods

Bluffton Middle School
Building Capacity = 1035
Programmatic Capacity = 855
Enrollment = 872
Size = 139,215 sf



Exterior Doors
37 = Exterior Doors

5. 2019 Lady's Island Middle Facilities Assessment



Lady's Island Middle School
Building Capacity = 1088
Programmatic Capacity = 801
Enrollment = 434
Size = 144,226 sf



100% Supervision of all main hallways & pods
39 staff members

Bluffton Middle School
Building Capacity = 1035
Programmatic Capacity = 855
Enrollment = 872
Size = 139,215 sf



100% Supervision of all main hallways
9 staff members

5. 2019 Lady's Island Middle Facilities Assessment



Cost to Renovate vs. Rebuild

1. Renovation

1. \$27.1 Million = 2019 Cost to Renovate Lady's Island Middle School
2. \$38.7 Million = 2024 Cost to Renovate Lady's Island Middle School

2. \$40.1 Million = Estimated 2024 new building for 475 students

3. Capacities

1. Renovated Lady's Island Middle School = 1088
2. Projection for FY2027-2028 = 403 students.
3. $403 / 85\% = 474$ students
4. New Lady's Island Middle School = Priced for 475 students. We would recommend a larger core facility with a planned expansion wing (which is not in cost estimate).

4. Renovation cost = 96% of New
