1. The position of Deputy Director Secondary

A four-year school plan is an obligatory document for all Dutch Schools. For European Schools it is obligatory to have a long-term strategic plan.

In the spring of 2022 we consulted staff, students on parents. The document was written on the basis of their input, was formally approved by the Participation Council ESH Secondary and by the Chairman of the Executive Board Rijnlands Lyceum. It is long document which conforms to all external demands of such a document. Unfortunately, implementation of the ambitions described in the document had to be put on hold because of the timetable crisis at the beginning of this school year. We are working on the first steps of implementation. One of the most important tasks of the new Deputy Director will be the implementation of this plan.

3. Preparing for next school year

Together with the timetablers for next year we are now working on the preparation for next school year, which is especially significant because of the timetable crisis at the beginning of this school year. We are confident we have the necessary person power, expertise and checks and balances to ensure that we will have a working timetable for the start of next school year.

4. Reorganisation of end school year

The updates to the final weeks of the school year aim to find a solution to the 'missed lessons at the beginning of this school year and to make better educational use of the last weeks of the school year. This update is also prompted by the fact that the final oral examinations take place later than last school year.

Entry requirements vary, e.g. for Mathematics and level of Dutch, while some universities offer courses in English only: examples include Biology at Radboud University Nijmegen and Global Project and Change Management at the Zeeland university of applied sciences. Maastricht University's offering seems to appeal to our students.

Library at ESH Promoting Library Collections



January signals the start of a new year and we decided to use the theme of new beginnings in our first display of 2023. Our display "New Year, New You" focused on books that contained information about learning new things, for example, a new skill, a new language or new ways to improve both mentally and physically. Many S6/S7 students are also in the university application process, so career related books were also displayed prominently. In keeping with the "new beginnings" idea, a second book club will start at the end of this month. Our first book club, for younger students, has been very successful with weekly meetings and lots of discussion. Our current book, Artichoke Hearts, is proving popular. In response to interest by older students we will begin a new book club, initially with S4 students but open to everyone. This will happen Thursday mornings at 8am before school lessons start. Our S6 and S7 students have all been busy with tests these last weeks. We, in the library, try to provide practical as well as pastoral care for students. Sometimes this means loaning out pencils, rulers, calculators and set squares, and other time it means chocolate and hugs! We also use our display boards to help motivate students to try their best and to keep going! The library has also been working with our teacher colleagues. Firstly, we welcome the opportunity to display students' work. This month we exhibited Ms. Nouri's S2 French class "Art & Science" work and book boxes from Ms. Calton's English class. We are also working with the English department to set up a reading challenge for S1s and S2s. Furthermore, we hope to facilitate a visit from a French author for the French department! Watch this space! The 27th of January marks International Holocaust Memorial Day. In recognition of this important event, the library displayed some information and real-life stories from that time. One of our students, Olivier H. wrote an interesting piece about Holocaust deniers. We hope that by making these displays we will promote awareness and interest in history.













The ICT Department and the Gifted &Talented program of ESH have organized a 3 days Astronaut Camp for 16 students from S3 and S4 at the Euro Space Center, in Belgium. The students, together with the two chaperones Ms lakovidou and Mr. Arévalo, had the opportunity to participate in different STEM activities related to Space and train like astronauts.











They have watched videos and learned about the history of Space exploration in an interactive way.

They have created their own paper rockets and they have launched them. The students have successfully participated in every stage of a space mission: take-off, orbiting, satellite release and return to Earth. They have worked as a team and they have been assigned different roles.

They also experienced the clean room where they made two satellites using different microprocessor and sensors and eventually they exchanged messages using Morse code.

They have done experiments related to the gravity and the air and afterwards they have experienced Moon and Mars gravity thanks to virtual reality technology. It has been an amazing and inspiring educational experience that all the participants particularly enjoyed!

In February our S5-S6 students will have the opportunity to join the Satellite Camp experience in the same premises. It's also worth mentioning that the Gifted & Talented program of our school subsidies these trips to give students the opportunity of developing their full potential. With the success of the Space Camp we are aiming at offering this exciting option students on a regular basis.







Gifted & Talented 10 Programme @ ESH

The Gifted and Talented programme at our school gives highly intelligent and motivated students the opportunity to broaden their view and accelerate their intellectual and personal development.

To meet the needs of all talented pupils we do not rely on intelligence tests only, but also take observations of our subject teachers and parents as stakeholders into account in the process.

In February we will deliver a screening that has been designed by the University of Nijmegen to assess the intelligence, creativity and motivations of our S1students and newcomers in higher classes, if parents enlist their children for it. This tool gives us the chance to find hidden talents as not all extremely bright students like to shine or are even struggling with their intelligence.

Once identified the student will receive more challenge in the subjects she/he is interested in to ensure that she/he is able to use the given potential. All teachers have been trained to work with gifted and talented

students
