Black History Fact by Explore The Archive

The practice of vaccinations was brought to America by a slave

"With the recent devastating spread of Covid and the life-saving vaccines that have started to turn the tide, some appreciation should be given to the man who brought this game-changing practice to the United States. In 1721, a smallpox epidemic struck the city of Boston. This highly contagious virus was killing hundreds during a time of lesser medical advancements, and it was an enslaved man by the name of Onesimus that changed everything."

"Onesimus was purchased in 1706 for Cotton Mather, a prominent Puritan minister. Though Mather held a great distrust for Onesimus, he knew that the man was clever. Amid the spreading sickness, Onesimus confided to Mather about the practice of inoculations, which had been used in Africa for centuries. Mather brought this vital information to Dr. Zabdiel Boylston, who, despite a major pushback against the idea, managed to successfully inoculate 240 people."

MSTEP

We have approximately 11 weeks/84 days before Michigan’s annual six-week testing season begins in April. M-Step is a high stakes assessment! Attendance, daily instruction, tutoring and intervention will be critical. Let’s be focused and ready to take action everyday! The results of the various assessments can influence college admissions, teacher evaluations, and whether third-graders are promoted.

Read by 3rd Grade and Attendance

“ In 2016, the Michigan Legislature passed a law that requires schools to identify learners who are struggling with reading and writing and to provide additional help. The law states that third graders may repeat third grade if they are more than one grade level behind beginning with the 2019-2020 school year.” At DEPSA we have a multi-tier support system to ensure all students have equitable access to high quality instruction and intervention to meet the needs of individual students.

Attendance Challenge (DON’T GET TO 15)

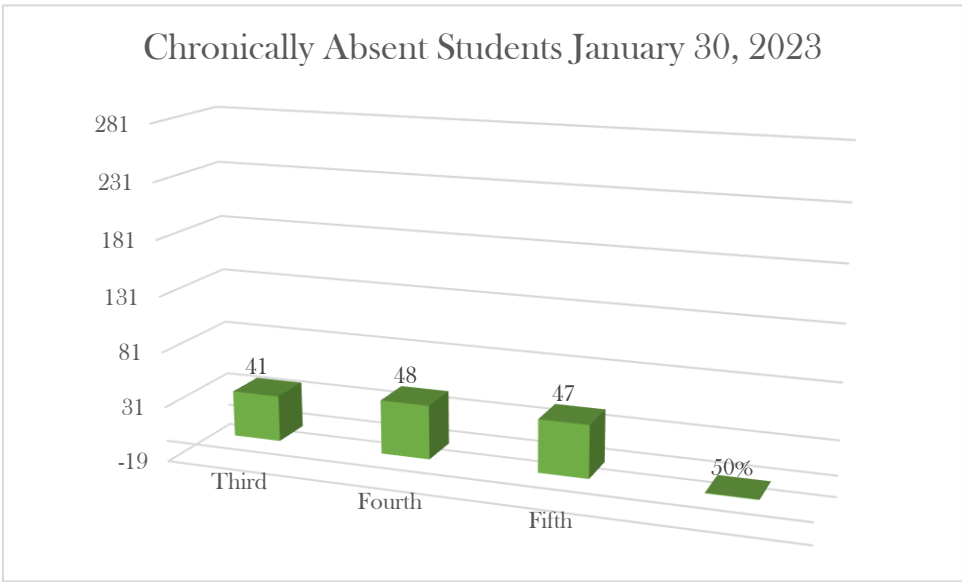
Chronic absenteeism can cause poor grades and is defined as **missing at least 10 percent (18 days) of days in a school year for any reason, including excused and unexcused absences**. Currently 50% of students have been identified as chronically absent per the state of Michigan.

Thank you for your support and diligence throughout this year! We are nearing the midpoint of the school year, which means there are less than 30 days left in Quarter 2/Semester 1. We encourage students to FINISH Strong! The weather is cold, the sun is hiding, but we MUST finish the year by attending school everyday on time! Every day counts as each day missed equals 7 hours of instructional time missed. We look forward to seeing ALL of our scholars daily in school. Remember that 2 absences per month will cause a student to be Chronically Absent by the end of the school year.

The number that we want to do our best to avoid is **15 (by the end of the year)**. If your child is currently below this number of absences, he or she can finish the year strong and not become Chronically Absent. If your child has exceeded this number for the year, it is critical that he/she is in school daily, on time.

NPFE Annual Goals

- **NWEA-** 60% or more of our students will meet their NWEA GOALS fall to spring targets in both reading and math
- **M-Step/PSAT-** proficiency will increase in both ELA and Math by 20% for grades 3-10
- **Attendance Goals-** Average daily attendance will be at 95% by June 2023; Chronic absenteeism will decrease by 15% in comparison to the 2021-2022 school year
- **Intervention-** Student usage will average 80% or higher during scheduled intervention time
- **Coaching Cycle-** Leaders will complete a minimum of 8 complete coaching cycles per teacher during the 2022-2023 school year.

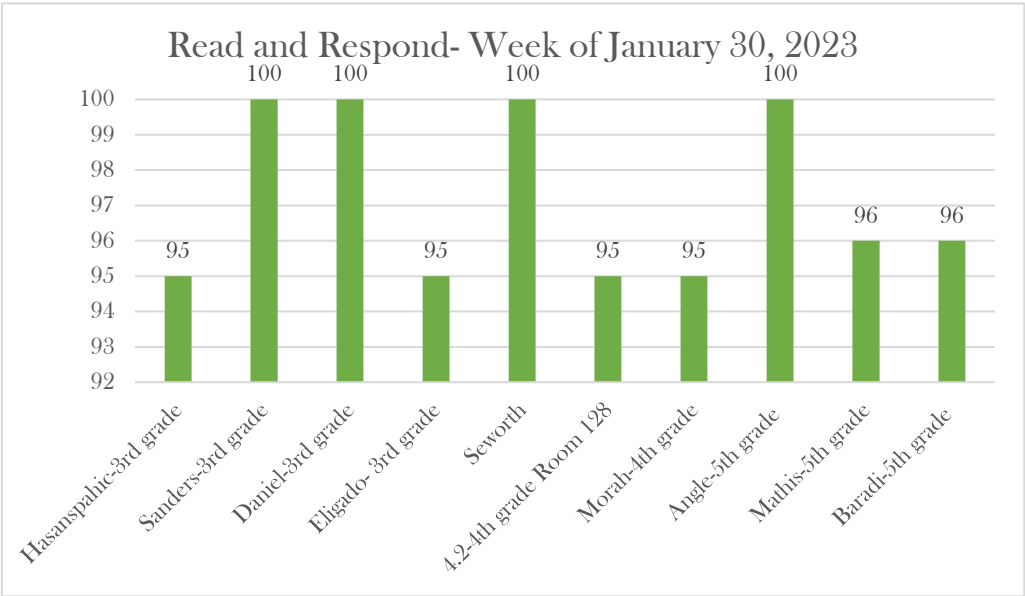

Read & Respond Homework

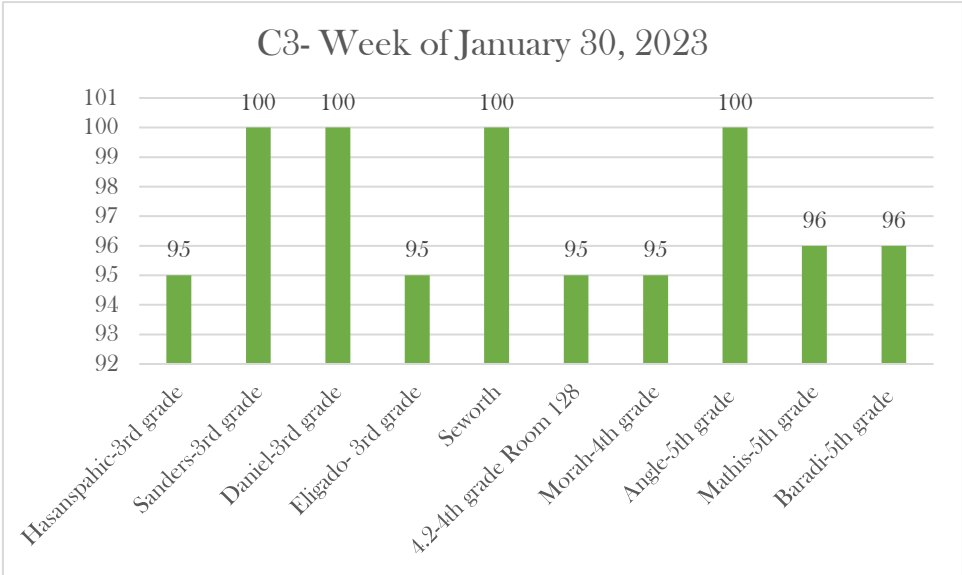

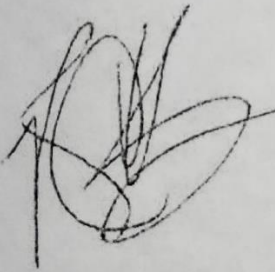
