Bucks County Technical High School (BCTHS) receives guidance from the Centers for Disease Control (CDC), the Pennsylvania Department of Education (PDE), the Pennsylvania Department of Health (PA DOH), and the Bucks County Health Department (BCHD). BCTHS will work in coordination with these agencies, and other federal, state & local authorities as necessary, to develop and refine expectations that meet all requirements. Ultimately, BCTHS will follow the language of the Bucks County Health Department (BCHD).

BCTHS will develop a communications document that will be posted on the school's website and communicated to students, parents, staff, and other stakeholders each time the Health and Safety Plan is updated.

BCTHS will revise this plan as necessary, based on changing guidance at any of these levels, at the required frequency. Such changes will be communicated to all stakeholders.

2. How will the LEA ensure continuity of services, including but not limited to services to address the students' academic needs, and students' and staff members' social, emotional, mental health, and other needs, which may include student health and food services?

BCTHS will continue to ensure safe learning and working environments for all students and staff.

BCTHS will provide in-person instruction during the 2021-22 school year. In events of Covid-related school closures and student absences, BCTHS is prepared to provide instruction virtually to allow for continuity of learning in conjunction with the school's Instructional Time application under Section 520.1 and approved by the local governing body and PDE. BCTHS will be able to quickly modify instructional delivery models to in-person instruction, virtual/remote instruction, and/or hybrid instruction.

BCTHS will continue to ensure all students receive instruction that meets state and federal standards and have the necessary support for success, including access to technology and connectivity.

BCTHS will follow any quarantine and/or isolation recommendations put forth by the BCDH. BCTHS Nurses will work with the BCHD in reporting positive COVID cases. Local COVID-19 testing laboratories will continue to report positive COVID-19 test results to the BCHD through the Pennsylvania National Electronic Disease Surveillance System (PA-NEDSS). BCTHS will consult with the BCHD in the event of any public health-related questions or concerns for guidance. This includes COVID-19. The BCHD may recommend temporary disease mitigation strategies such as increased physical distancing, masking, etc. It is recommended that individuals remain at home if they feel ill. BCTHS Nurses will monitor and make recommendations for the return to school for those who test positive for COVID-19, per health guidelines. Notifications will be made if/when necessary. BCTHS will notify any individual, classroom, school, or community of any positive case of COVID-19 if/when necessary, per BCHD guidelines.
f. <u>Diagnostic</u> and screening testing;	BCTHS will continue to recommend that all students and staff receive the COVID-19 vaccination. BCTHS will continue to recommend that individuals that do not feel well or are experiencing symptoms to NOT report to school/work. BCTHS will regularly communicate best practices for health and personal hygiene to all stakeholders in an effort to reinforce healthy instructional and work environments. BCTHS will refer any individual in need of a COVID-19 test to a health provider or other testing programs.

BCTHS will continue to partner with federal, state, local, and health care agencies to promote and offer opportunities to receive the COVID-19 vaccination.
