What is Compline?

You may have heard the service of Compline announced and be wondering what it is. Very simply put, Compline is the last prayer liturgy (or office) of the day. It is a part of the liturgy of Catholic, Anglican, Lutheran, Eastern and Greek Orthodox churches as well as some others. In many monasteries it signaled the beginning of the "Great Silence" wherein monks and guests would remain silent until after the first service of the next day. In the Anglican faith it was once merged with Vespers to form the service of Evening Prayer. It has since been separated back out to be its own service. You can find it in our Book of Common Prayer starting on page 127. Compline is a contemplative service that emphasizes spiritual peace.

Here, at St. James, we have a men's Compline choir that offers Compline on the third Sunday of most months. Compline starts at 7pm and lasts about a half hour. It is a relaxed, come as you are service. We ask only that you listen. Most people stand for the creed when it is chanted, but that isn't mandatory. There are no bulletins, no hymnals, no prayer books; it is a time for you to disconnect from the cares of life and be with God. Children are welcome, and you are free to bring a pillow and blanket for them.

Women's Monday Night Bible Study

This Lent, the Women's Monday Night Bible Study will be studying the book, *Entering the Passion of Jesus*, by Amy-Jill Levine. This six week study will take us through the history and literature surrounding the last days of Jesus' life. According to the author:

Jesus' final days were full of risk. Every move he made was filled with anticipation, danger, and the potential for great loss or great reward. Jesus risked his reputation when he entered Jerusalem in a victory parade. He risked his life when he dared to teach in the Temple. His followers risked everything when they left behind their homes, or anointed him with costly perfume. We take risks as we read and re-read these stories, finding new meanings and new challenges. In Entering the Passion of Jesus, author, professor, and biblical scholar Amy-Jill Levine explores the biblical texts surrounding the Passion story. She shows us how the text raises ethical and spiritual questions for the reader, and how we all face risk in our Christian experience.

We will begin our study on Monday night, February 27, at 6:30 p.m. in the Vestry Room of Green Hall. We try to leave by 8:10 p.m. after prayer.
