What is our Purpose?

EVERY student should graduate with either a business/industry recognized credential, benchmark test scores, dual enrollment credit, or military enlistment.

EVERY student should learn the importance of being present and engaged.

EVERY student should learn the importance of representing themselves to the best of their ability.

EVERY student CAN be successful!

What Does Academic Dual Enrollment Mean?



Academic Dual Enrollment allows eligible high school students to earn high school and college credits at the same time.

College courses count toward high school graduation credits and count on college transcripts as part of their college GPA.

These courses are all part of general college programs that lead to an associate's or bachelor's degree.

A "C" or higher in the course is REQUIRED

What does Academic Dual Enrollment look like at CHS?



Chickasaw High School works closely with Bishop State Community College to offer college classes to high school students that count toward a variety of college majors.

10th-12th grade only Must have a 2.5 or higher GPA

English 101/102 (11th/12th)-18 on Eng ACT or a 5-higher on the Accuplacer writing test

All courses are taken at CHS for college credit and are FREE to students who meet the criteria! Students are either taught by a CHS dual enrollment teacher or will take an online course with a BSCC instructor.



What are Advanced Placement Courses?



Advanced Placement courses (created by CollegeBoard), are classes that offer curriculum that is aligned with intro-level college courses. They focus on writing skills, critical thinking skills, and can even earn college credit if a student makes a qualifying score on an AP Exam.
