General Contractor Process

As of November 7, 2022 I had access to the 99% progress drawings for the building project for the district. The week of November 21st HSR sent the plans out to receive bids from general contractors. We are tentatively looking to receive the bids by December 20, 2022. As part of the bid process there will be a pre-bid walkthrough around December 6, 2022.

Shortly after receiving the bids the Board will review the bids and decide on how to proceed. If everything goes well the Board will choose a general contractor and the process will proceed. The hope is for the project to begin work in late March or early April. Of course weather will play a role of when the construction actually starts.

Once the project begins it is planned to proceed in the following manner. Phase 1, which will include the construction of the classroom wing from the ag building to the east edge of the current main doors and the office addition are planned to be completed in December of 2023. In January and February of 2024 the 1921 section, the 1938 section and the office portion of the building will be torn down. Then in March/April of 2024 the remainder of the classroom wing will be constructed with the intent of being completed by December of 2024.

Some other key transitions will occur during the nearly two-year process. In the summer of 2023 the current library will be converted into three rooms which will eventually be the MS special needs room, the HS Special needs room and a staff workroom. The upper commons will be converted into 3 temporary rooms for use while phase II of the project is being completed. A temporary wall will be built between the stage and the gym to temporarily house the library. Eventually the upper commons will be converted into the new library with two collaboration rooms included in the space.

Looking forward to the next two years it currently seems like it will be an eternity. I am sure once it gets started the time will go by quickly and the project will be completed before we know it. I am very confident that during construction there will be many difficult situations to deal with, but I am just as confident that all involved will make it work.

In the end the community will have a very nice and accessible facility for the students to learn and the community to attend events.

Information on Influenza



The "flu", also called Influenza, is a very contagious <u>respiratory</u> disease caused by a virus. It starts around November and is usually seen up through March. It can be mild in nature or very severe, requiring hospitalization. It is different from a cold in that it usually comes on suddenly. Common symptoms of the flu are as follows:

- *Fever or feeling feverish with chills—not everyone will have a fever
- *Cough
- *Sore throat
- *Runny or stuffy nose
- *Muscle and body aches
- *Fatigue (tiredness)
- *Headache
- *Children may have vomiting or diarrhea, not common in adults.

Usually when a person gets the flu they can recover in a few days up until 2 weeks. However, pneumonia is a complication of the flu and can be life-threatening. Other complications from getting the flu are bronchitis, sinus infections, and ear infections. The flu can also make certain health conditions worse. For example, adults and children who have asthma will most likely have more asthma attacks because of having the flu.

Flu is spread to others up to 6 feet away by droplets when a person sneezes, coughs or talk. Another way the virus spreads, though not as common, is through touching surfaces with the flu virus and then touching your mouth, nose, or eyes. Washing hands or using alcohol-based hand rub is the single best method for preventing spread of the flu.

Those at higher risk for getting the flu are the elderly, people who have chronic medical conditions, pregnant women, and young children. Influenza is unpredictable, it varies from person-to-person and one season to another. Vaccination is one of the best ways to avoid the illness.

If you or your child gets the flu please stay home until the fever is gone without the use of medicine for at least 24 hours. Limit contact with others and wash your hands often.

RSV...What you need to know?

Symptoms

People infected with RSV usually show symptoms within 4 to 6 days after getting infected. Symptoms of RSV infection usually include

- Runny nose
- Decrease in appetite
- Coughing
- Sneezing
- Fever

Wheezing

These symptoms usually appear in stages and not all at once. In very young infants with RSV, the only symptoms may be irritability, decreased activity, and breathing difficulties.

Care

Most RSV infections go away on their own in a week or two. There is no specific treatment for RSV infection, though researchers are working to develop vaccines and antivirals (medicines that fight viruses).

Take steps to relieve symptoms

- **Manage fever and pain** with over-the-counter fever reducers and pain relievers, such as acetaminophen or ibuprofen. (Never give aspirin to children.)
- **Drink enough fluids.** It is important for people with RSV infection to drink enough fluids to prevent dehydration (loss of body fluids).
- Talk to your healthcare provider before giving your child nonprescription cold medicines. Some medicines contain ingredients that are not good for children.

RSV Prevention

There are steps you can take to help prevent the spread of RSV. Specifically, if you have cold-like symptoms you should

 Cover your coughs and sneezes with a tissue or your upper shirt sleeve, not your hands

Wash your hands often with soap and water for at least 20 seconds

• Avoid close contact, such as kissing, shaking hands, and sharing cups and eating utensils, with others

Clean frequently touched surfaces such as doorknobs and mobile devices

The meeting was called to order at 6:00 pm in the Collaboration Room by President Kerry Holland, The following members were present Dee Paulson, Jim Baumgartner, Jessica Seffrood, Val Dunlavey, Kerry Holland, Alicia Sigafus and Jason Figi. Also present was Administration of Willy Chambers, Cory Mils and 8 guest.

Administration Report:

Chambers:

Last week was School Board recognition week. Thank you for your service to the community, the staff, and the students. Your work in this role is not understood by many and is underappreciated by most.

The annual meeting is coming up on October 24, 2022, at 7 PM.

Along with a few staff members, I will are going to look into a FabLab grant through the Wisconsin Economic Development Corporation.

The state budget for 23-25 will be coming up shortly after the election. I believe most of you have heard me mention the fiscal cliff that we will be experiencing for the next biennium budget. WASDA and the AASA will be pushing for a three-prong approach to increase funding: 1. Increase special education reimbursement which decreases fund 10 to fund 27 transfer and makes more money available for all students, A per pupil increase either in the revenue limit or per-pupil categorical aide and lastly non-competitive grants for school-based mental health.

The current revenue limit worksheet is attached. The mill rate is at 6.35 based on the estimated property value provided by Baird. This mill rate is 1.2 below the projected number used for the referendum. You could tax for more to offset the additional debt, considering the current economy I will suggest that the Board leaves the mill rate where it comes out to when everything is done. This will be part of the proceedings at the annual meeting.

Open enrollment has moved in the right direction:

- 2021-2022 OE In FTE 43 which brings in \$393,550
- 2021-2022 OE Out FTE 68.2 which costs \$557,401
- a difference of (\$163,851)

Current

- 2022-2023 OE In FTE 48.7 which brings in \$461,158
- 2022-2023 OE Out FTE 59.9 which costs \$521,728
- a difference of (\$60,570)

The special education staff is working on finishing up the Reading Drives Achievement: Procedural Self-Assessment (RDA: PSCA). The teachers along with Ms. Smith are submitting the last 5 documents needed to complete the review.

Melissa has been working diligently on a daily basis to fill substitute teacher/aide roles. I applaud her for her efforts. Mr. Milz and I on occasion have needed to step in and assist in filling an opening. The staff has been flexible and supportive as well in making things work for all of our students.




