School Resource Officer Body Cams

The safety and security of our students, staff and district community is a top priority for the Westlake City School District. An important component of our safety strategy includes having a School Resource Officer (SRO) assigned to each of our four school buildings.

Beginning this month, the Westlake City School District SROs will wear body cameras while working in our school buildings. The Westlake Police Department previously mandated all WPD officers wear body cameras beginning in November 2022. Our SROs are Westlake Police Department officers who have received additional training and certification to prepare them to identify and prevent crime in the K-12 school setting.

Body cameras are being used by more SROs every year and can help protect our students, staff, and the SROs from false accusations, claims of wrongdoing, or claims of abuse. The cameras hold the officers and others accountable and could help prevent or decrease dangerous or violent situations. Body cameras in schools monitor the school building environment, document any concerning events, and ensure the upstanding performance of the district SROs.

It is important to note the body cameras will not be recording continuously. In fact, they will only be recording when the SROs are in the act of "law enforcement activities." Even when a camera captures "law enforcement activities" laws such as HB 425 restrict the video footage from being considered public record.

Daily activities, conversations and personal interactions will not be recorded. A red flashing light will indicate when the body camera is recording.

We believe that the Westlake City Schools will be a safer place with the use of these body cameras. The cameras have the potential to enhance our existing safety practices and procedures.
