What makes Bury Grammar Kindergarten unique?

Our Kindergarten is not simply a nursery: we are part of a school, with pupils ranging from age 3 to 18.

We teach children to read and write and use numbers from the youngest age - and they benefit from the influence of seeing older children every day who are already in Infant School.

While our childcare will fill you with confidence, we are so much more than a nursery: we are preparing children for life at school.

Why choose BGS Primary Division above other local primary schools?

We get asked this question a lot! While we can't comment on other schools, we do know what works well for BGS pupils.

In a nutshell, what is crucial is our independence.

Our independence means that:

- We are able to offer a wide range of subjects and enrich pupils' learning experiences from the youngest age
- Our pupils are not constrained by any glass ceiling at all: we can (and do!) encourage them to 'get ahead' and move on rapidly
- We do not have to follow the 'latest trend' in teaching; rather, we use methods which have been shown to work
- BGS has the means and freedom to be forward-looking and innovative, for example, provide every pupil with a Microsoft Surface device
- We attract the very best teachers
- Our facilities are extraordinary
- We offer more than 50 extra-curricular activities each week.

And what makes BGS Primary Division unique compared with other independent schools? We also get asked this question a lot - and once more, it is not easy to answer as we are focussing on our own school.

But what we can tell you about BGS is:

- Our pupils move on to Senior School having a fantastic head start in every way

ACADEMIC EXCELLENCE

How will I know if my child is doing well?

We should start by saying that it is the norm for our children to fly!

Every day, we capture special moments and will share these with you - via our Learning Journey platform, or ReallySchools platform for Kindergarten and Reception pupils. Our weekly newsletter keeps parents up to date with Primary Division news and whole school news! We believe it is important to keep you regularly informed with your child's progress as we prepare them for their next steps.

Communication is something on which we pride ourselves at BGS. We are likely to talk every day and also meet formally with parents during each of the three academic terms. You will always know how much progress your children are making and we hope you will encourage them to enjoy their achievements, as we will!

What will the BGS Infant and Junior curriculum hold for my child? An ambitious, varied and challenging programme of learning designed to give your child a significant head start in life.

We think it's fabulous to learn to read and write and know your times tables at the youngest age. Mastery in English and Maths is a given at our School. We like to open up our children's experiences beyond the core curriculum to learning Science, History, Geography, French, Art, Drama, Design Technology, IT, Music, PE, Swimming, Philosophy and Sport from the youngest age... And more!

The key to a fabulous education is the curriculum.

Do you have an extra-curricular programme?

Yes, we believe a happy and fulfilled child is a busy child! We have more than 50 extra-curricular activities on offer every week, in which your child can participate, the vast majority of which are covered within the fees (so there is no need to pay for out of school swimming lessons, Art clubs, dance classes etc).

Children are encouraged to try everything! It is important for children to experience activities which they know they love doing, and also something which takes them out of their comfort zone.

At BGS, we encourage our children to get involved, as exploring interests, and developing skills at an early age provide the beginnings of a lifetime of interests and enjoyment!

Do pupils have homework?

Yes, in moderation, and as appropriate according to age. The aims of homework at BGS are:

- To learn good habits from a young age
- To continue the joy of learning beyond the school gates
- To explore individual interests and nurture talents
- To learn more and get ahead! •

Will my child go swimming and what sporting facilities will they use?

ALL our children go swimming in our school pool - and this starts in Kindergarten.

Our sporting facilities really are quite extraordinary. Our infant pupils have an amazing experience with their very own sports hall and use of our extensive 45-acre campus, including a 4G pitch, a dance studio, and spacious playing fields!

PREPARING FOR THE FUTURE

I've heard that transition from one year group into another is handled really well at BGS. Is this the case? Absolutely!

Do you think about what it is like for a parent as their child progresses through school?

What is the position on the Senior School entrance exam? Pupils who join us in Infants or Juniors can expect not to have to take our entrance examination *

This is because we are confident that our primary education gives our pupils a fantastic head start and because an exam could not possibly tell us anything we did not already know about them.

However, some parents like their children to face the challenge of an exam and choose for their child to sit our entrance examination in any case. We understand this view and are perfectly happy with it.

Given that BGS Senior School is becoming more and more popular (300 external applicants for around 80 places last year) you can see why parents might be keen for their child to start early with us.

Send your child to BGS and the next educational decision comes at age 18 and which university.

*There might be exceptional circumstances in which we would ask parents for their child to sit the entrance examination, but this would be discussed in advance.

BGS TEACHERS

We have heard you are fantastic at communicating with busy families. How do you do this? Pupils are warmly greeted at the door each school day by the staff based in that area of school: our Kindergarten Manager and Key Workers, Infant teachers, Junior teachers and the Senior team.

We know this ensures a great start to the day, embedding good routines, making sure our children feel welcomed and creating a sense of belonging.

School is open from 8am until 4pm, every day. For parents who need to get to work, we also have a great Wrap Around Care facility from 7.30am until 6pm each day.

We assume your teachers are well qualified. Is this the case?

Yes, absolutely. We are lucky to attract a high number of applicants to every post and are therefore able to employ well qualified, highly motivated and committed teachers and key workers.

They really are the life blood of the school and our parents are extremely positive about them!

How would you describe BGS primary teachers?

Our teachers are kind, enthusiastic and experts at getting the best out of young people.

Your child will enjoy the best possible balance of (a) teachers who are absolute primary experts, teach the majority of subjects and provide pastoral care and (b) Senior School trained teachers who are subject experts and are able to help your child get ahead.

You say you know all your pupils well. Is this correct?

Yes. Every pupil is well known, including by our Primary Principal. Class sizes are relatively small (but not so small there is no room for a range of friendship groups) and staff-children ratios in Kindergarten are carefully adhered to.

You only need to spend a few minutes at BGS to see how well we know our pupils and how well they know us!

Is good parent-school communication important to you?

Quality communication is extremely important to us and our families. Our teaching staff are approachable, friendly professionals with the best interests of the pupils at the heart of everything they do.

While you may well see your child's teacher every day, if you don't see them in person, you can send them an email, phone us or make an appointment to come in.

A number of people families have commented to us that our communications are really impressive.

KINDERGARTEN PRACTICALITIES

Do you offer part time places in Kindergarten?

Yes, of course, because we listen carefully to our families. We appreciate that our parents lead very busy lives, and we are here to help. We offer a range of flexible options for our Kindergarten children to suit every lifestyle. Parents can choose full or part time places to suit their needs, and we offer 30 funded hours (free to parents) for 3-to 4-year-olds under the Government Scheme.

Do you accept childcare vouchers?

Yes! We accept childcare vouchers for tuition fees including Breakfast & After School Club and Holiday Club. Any payment of fees by vouchers is subject to the provision of the parent contract, in that fees are paid by direct debit. Parents wishing to use childcare vouchers are asked to make arrangements with the Bursar's Office in advance by calling: 0161 696 8600 or emailing *bursarsinfo@burygrammar.com*. We will provide you with all the information you need!

How do I claim 30 hours funding?

It is simple and we are happy to help guide you through this! Parents who qualify for 30 funded hours can choose full or part time places under our All-Inclusive Package or our Flexi Term Time Package. Our All-Inclusive Package provides a place for your child for 51 weeks of the year. Under our Flexi Term Time Package, your child attends Kindergarten during each of our three academic terms with the option of joining our Holiday Club for any number of days or weeks during the school holidays.

For those who do not qualify for 30 funded hours, we continue to offer 15 funded hours and both full time and part time options are available under this scheme.
