UPPER ADAMS SCHOOL DISTRICT BOARD MINUTES OF APRIL 21, 2015

The minutes of the regular board meeting of the Upper Adams School District Board for April 21, 2015 that was held in the District Board Room, Biglerville, Pennsylvania are as follows:

President Elaine Jones called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m. The following people responded to roll call: Mr. Crouse, Mr. Ebbert, Ms. Jones, Mr. Rutkowski, Mr. Seibert and Mrs. Solberg. Absent were: Dr. Fee, Mr. Long and Mr. Regentin, who were excused for personal reasons. Dr. Doll, Superintendent, Mr. McQuaide, School Board Solicitor and Mr. Lawrence, School Board Secretary were also present.

Approval of Minutes

Mr. Ebbert made a motion, seconded by Mr. Seibert to accept the minutes of the March 17, 2015 Regular Board Meeting. All ayes; no nays; motion carried.

Recognition of Delegations

Mr. Justin Bruhn, Administrative Director of CP-AVTS distributed the annual Fact Sheet from the school, which highlighted all of the accomplishments of the students as well as showcased the various programs offered there. He then introduced Cooley Matthews, a student from UASD, who is part of the HVAC course of study. He spoke of his experiences at CP-AVTS, stating that he received an apprenticeship with McLaughlin's Refrigeration and intends to pursue full time employment with them upon graduation.

Treasurer's Report

Mr. Crouse presented the Financial Report, the Revenue Budget Report and the Expenditure Budget Report for the period ending March 31, 2015, the Cafeteria Report for the periods ending January 31, 2015 and February 28, 2015 as well as the Student Account Report, the Student Council Sub Accounts Report and the Principals' Account Report for the periods ending February 28, 2015 and March 31, 2015, making a motion to accept the Treasurer's Report. Legislative Report/PSBA Report – Mr. Rutkowski commented on the different yet similar approaches to state pension reform that are being taken by the governor and the legislature. Other highlights included PA House Bill 707 pertaining to the Prevailing Wage Act and, on the federal level, the Every Child Achieves Act which is an updated version of the No Child Left Behind Act.

Ms. Jones attended the PSBA Advocacy Forum and met with representatives Moul and Tallman as well as Senator Alloway. She thanked Mr. Moul for his bill on cyber school tuition and stated that the education committee is working on a bill to bring teacher negotiated contracts to the public prior to the board voting on it.
