Hello BSD Board Members and Committee Members,

My name is Ajay Garg and I live on Twinflower Drive (Arbor View Community). My son Aarav Garg goes to Kindergarten at Jacob Wismer (JW). Through this I would like to highlight why Arbor View neighborhood shall stay with JW.

Reasons why Arbor View should stay with JW:

1. Our community was built in 1998 and JW was built in 2001. Therefore, for last 15 years all kids from our community has been going to JW. It will be be unfair if we are moved to new school.
2. Our community is very united and have a very strong bond with JW.
3. More than 150 students which is almost 22% of total enrollment at JW are currently enrolled at JW. According to historical trend enrollment growth at JW has been constant or slowed down for last few years. If we are moved then enrollment numbers at JW will go down significantly.
4. Kids goes to JW by taking a backside natural trail which is very safe and convenient. This route is less than 0.5miles from JW.
5. Crossing Springville road will not be safe for kids.
6. The amount of development taking place on north of Springville road will more than suffice the enrollment needs of new K-5 Elementary school.

My husband Brian Starr attended the first Boundary Adjustment Committee meeting on October 6th at Springville High School. He was hoping there would be a Q&A session, but since there was not we have a few questions we're hoping you can answer before the next meeting:

1. Do you have projected Jacob Wismer enrollment for next year (2017-18)?
2. Has there been a decision made on allowing older students at Springville and Jacob Wismer to be "grandfathered" in so they can graduate at their current elementary schools?
3. Do you have forecasted enrollment projections for Sunset and Westview High Schools for each academic year for the next decade? Many folks in the community have suggested that Westview High School will be overcrowded in the coming years. I know that high school boundary adjustment meetings are nearing decision, but it concerns me that our neighborhood might be continually battling overcrowding problems and boundary changes for many years to come. Data that you have concerning this would be very helpful!
