Dear Advisory Committee,

My name is Kelly Berg. My husband (Douglas Bowles) and I, along with our two sons (Lucas - age 3 and Matias - age 1) moved into the Arbor View neighborhood in July. We are new to Portland and specifically chose to buy a house in the Arbor View community because the community is within the Jacob Wismer school boundary. We are extremely disappointed to learn that the school district is considering adjusting the elementary school boundary for our neighborhood. We were aware that new boundaries were being drawn, but there was no discussion of this particular neighborhood or this particular school when we purchased our home.

We are also flabbergasted that this neighborhood would be under consideration for a boundary adjustment. Jacob Wismer is a beautiful 10-minute walk from our house. With the addition of the new THRPD walking trail, the path from our house to the school will be almost entirely on trails. The proposed K-12 school may still be relatively close to our house, but to walk there would require walking along Bethany Blvd, which is a busy and at times, dangerously narrow road.

Lucas, our 3-yo son can already make the walk to Jacob Wismer and we visited the school and playground there several times a week during the summer. It's a beautiful school and he loved the playground. I love the walk to the school - through Kaiser Woods Park and along the trails. We are so excited about him attending that school and completely devastated that he may not.

Although our children are not in school yet, I worry about the other children in our neighborhood who would suffer from abruptly changing schools. Explaining to elementary students why they have to go to a different school when their family hasn't moved seems fraught with pitfalls. And while grandfathering children and their siblings into Jacob Wismer and sending new students to the new school may be an option, it seems unfair and overly complicated from a logistics perspective.

I have also come to understand that Arbor View was a founding community for the Jacob Wismer school and that apparently our neighborhood contributes both to the economic and ethnic diversity of the school. As such, a boundary adjustment that specifically impacts our neighborhood seems particularly curious.

If additional space is needed, I might suggest raising the capital to make the necessary adjustments to the school rather than simply closing the doors.

Hello Committee members,

I live in Twinflower Dr (Jacob Wismer school district) and have few concerns about JW elementary boundary changes for FY17.

Information from JW enrollment numbers (https://www.beaverton.k12.or.us/depts/facilities/boundary/Elementary%20Boundary%20Process /10.6.16/10.6.16%20Presentation.pdf) shows that the numbers have not increased and have in fact gone down from high 700s to low 700s in last 3-4 years. This may be due to the fact that many families are moving from apartment to newer homes.

Based on the new housing units (almost 2500) and new expected students numbers in the pdf above, looks like new K-5 school will be filled by new construction itself in few years (3-5) as at least 750 new students will be added to North Bethany area. It will be shortsightedness to move kids from JW neighborhood to new K-5. Do we have good estimates as how many new kids are coming in each year 2017, 2018 etc? The way we have seen construction activity, new homes may be coming in faster than what we are predicting. It would be good to have the detailed info and do further analysis. So for new K-5 school if we are planning to start with 500 in FY17, it may very well reach the limit of 750 within next 2-3 years needing another boundary adjustment. The realistic start number should be close to 350 or even less (depending on the housing readiness) in the first year.

Please consider all these before readjusting JW school boundary where the school is at good capacity.

I am a resident in the Arbor View community south of Springville road. I am writing to recommend keeping the Arbor View community in Jacob Wismer Elementary school.

I am a working mother of a four-year old and a 10-month old. Jacob Wismer Elementary is much closer to our house comparing to the newly build school north of Springville road. More importantly, we can walk to JWE without crossing any major roads. Driving almost everyday along Springville, I noticed at first hand of the increasing traffic and lacking of traffic lights on Springville. Even with new traffic lights installed, the road is simply not safe for kids to cross alone. Unlike Kaiser or Bethany, speed limit on Springville is much higher. Further, since Sprinville is more rural than Kaiser or Bethany, Sprinville is more prone to speeding.

Moreover, having living in the Arbor View community for over 5 years, I believe that kids of the Arbor View community attending JWE is a natural choice. My four-year old has been playing with kids attending JWE for more than two years. She would feel the adjustment from day care to school easier when there're familiar faces on the school bus and inside the classroom.
