Hello,

I have two children attending Springville k-8 and we live in the new neighborhood between old Brugger and Springville west of Kaiser. Currently we can walk/bike to school, but if we were to move to new Kaiser school, this is no longer possible with only way to school is a narrow busy road(kaiser). This seems particularly unfair because we don't have the school bus option. If all factors being equal, other neighborhoods such as very southeast of current Springville boundary should be the one more apt to move because they already take the school bus and it's probably even easier to transport them to Kaiser than to Springville.

When I see the committee's map, it doesn't seem like school bus availability is taken into account. Students who don't have access to school bus should have priority to stay in my opinion especially if it means depriving us with both walk/bike/school bus option.

Another consideration I want to point out is after school program. I was waitlisted for a long time for my kids to attend on site after school program for my two kids. If we were to move and that program is no longer available to us, it is a big challenge to arrange for that the coming school year. I think parents who work full time struggle much to arrange for afterschool programs, and moving would disrupt the stability we have now.

Please let me know if you are taking those two things into account so we know what factors are considered to adjust the boundaries.

There are parts of Arbor View that are within walking distance of JW and perhaps those areas should remain at JW, but we cannot stop the rapid growth and development of the North Bethany area, and just because our neighborhood was a flagship neighborhood of JW doesn't mean that we will always be. Do these also take into consideration the area bound by 185th Rd, Springville Rd and 183rd? Previous maps showed  $53+28 = 81$  kids there in 2016.

Have these been accounted for? If yes then that's good.

If not and if they go to the nearest Springville K-5 elementary the numbers will go up accordingly.

After adding these numbers for 2021, in Scenario 1 the numbers for Springville will be upwards of 1000, in Scenario 2 upwards of 950 and in Scenario 3 around 750.

Overall Scenario 3 looks the best among all the options. It is important that JW community is not disrupted by this change and Springville is given a respite from the overcrowding to focus on being an exceptional K-8 school.
