





Honors in Grade 9

 - Honors level of Math
- If you do not choose to take Honors in 9th grade it does not preclude you from any advanced classes in grades 10, 11, or 12 (Honors, Advanced Placement, or International Baccalaureate)



Honors 9 – Information

- Things to consider regarding selecting Honors/AP courses.
 - Grades (7th & 8th Grade)
 - NWEA-MAP Test Scores (Reading & Math) if available.
 - Work habits/extracurricular activities
- Students can self select into individual courses to make more appropriate choices to balance their schedules (and lives) to ultimately do better in the subjects where they feel most confident.
- In previous years we have had very high numbers of students who were interested in Honors course work.



Honors 9 – Information

 After a specified time there will be limited switches from Honors to Regular courses – changes would only happen at the semester.

 Honors Math (Hon Adv Alg & Precalc) has a specific performance contract that you will sign off on if you select that level once the class is started.
