In 2022, Corinth's archery team ended the season at the State Championships in Jackson. They placed ninth in Division 2, which is aligned with MHSAA 3A and 4A schools. The 2022 season had a team of 25 archers with varying levels of skill and experience. Corinth High School (CHS) hosted their first ever home match, which was met with great crowds of parents and fans.

Brisanda Luna-Lopez was the first archer from CHS to sign a collegiate scholarship and she is performing well for Blue Mountain Christian University this season. Several former CHS archers have joined the club team at Northeast Mississippi Community College, which won the Mississippi State Championship.

Almost 60 archers tried out for the 2023 season and 36 archers made the team. Archery is the fastest growing school sport in the state. North Mississippi boasts eight of the top 10 schools in Mississippi for archery, meaning CHS is in a competitive division.

"It's really an honor to get to coach this great group of athletes," said Head Coach Brent Johnson. "This is my first year as head coach and Coach Lyles left some big shoes to fill. My message to the team has always been and will continue to be one of constant improvement. We are proud to have earned a spot in Jackson last year and were happy to be in the top 10, but we are not satisfied. This year we need to continue to progress. This year is our last year in Division 2 due to reclassification. Therefore, we want to end it again in Jackson and higher than ninth place."



In 2022, the varsity baseball team finished second in Division 1-4A with an overall record of 19-17. They competed in the third round of the state playoffs. The team also had two student-athletes selected as all-stars by the Northeast Mississippi Coaches Association for Better Baseball (NEMCABB) and one student-athlete selected as an all-star by Mississippi Association of Coaches (MAC)

This season, the team returns six of nine starters, making it a strong lineup. Seniors on the team include Broderick Alexander, Devon Jones, Samuel Curtis, Blake Briggs, Carson Kiddy, Jaxson Laster, Ethan Huff and John Neal Welch.

Additionally, three of those seniors have signed scholarships to play college baseball: Samuel Curtis at Northeast Community College; Ethan Huff at Itawamba Community College; and John Neal Welch at Northeast Community College.

"I am excited about this group of young men," said Head Coach Kevin Williams. "Last year we had a lot of inexperience, and they really grew up right in front of us. By the end of the year, we were playing great baseball and getting outstanding performances and contributions from a number of players. These guys have worked extremely hard this off-season, and I am very excited to watch them compete on the field this spring."



Last year, our 4x800m girls team (Elsie Wilbanks, Catherine Grisham, Andi Kate Holley and Emma Hall) won the State Championship and set a school record of 10:34. Our 4x800m boys team (Clark Carmichiel, Ross Evans, Sam Evans and Parker LeGoff) finished second at State, just .17 seconds shy of first place and set a school and State records.

The following athletes also went to State: Pierce Peterson and Briley Briggs (pole vaulters); Jack Gibson (pole vaulter) won silver; Ricardo Venegas (3200m) won 4th place; Clark Carmichiel (4x800m, 400m, 4x400m); and Emma Hall (4x800m, 1600m, 800m).

"This year my expectations are very high," said Head Coach Luke Hatcher. "We have added Coach Ryan Summers who has helped coach many teams to State Championships. We are bringing back a core boys sprinting group in the 100, 200, 4x100, and 4x200. We are also bringing back both the 4x800m relay squads that made big impacts at State last year. Also, our pole vaulting crew is bringing back everyone so I look for more success from them this year. From sprints to jumps to throws to distance, we should have some great athletes see success in their events."
