## II Superintendent's Report

## A. Superintendent Update / District Wide Reports / Correspondence

#### MCAS Update

Mrs. Goguen reported that the MCAS results are public, letters will be mailed to parents/guardians later this week. This is the first year for the next-generation MCAS assessments for grades 3-8, these results will serve as a benchmark for the test taken this school year.

## 3. Transportation Incident Update

On October 13<sup>th</sup> we had an incident where a student was left unattended on a bus for approx. 90 minutes. This is unacceptable and concerning for the district. The police were notified and investigating the situation. AA Transportation removed the driver and monitor and are holding their own investigation. CEO and General Manger, Ron Ernewein and Webster Manager Linda Perno are here this evening to answer any questions

Mr. Ernewein apologized to all effected by this unfortunate situation. He has reviewed the training requirements for all drivers at AA Transportation.

Mr. Avlas stated that Webster has had a 20 year experience with AA Transportation and they were prompt to respond with this incident.

## 4. Park Avenue Elementary and Webster Middle Report Card Update

Mr. Zajac and Mrs. Coleman have put together committee's to review / create new report cards. Webster Middle School will go back to letter grade report cards. Templates of the new report cards were given. Mrs. Coleman spoke of the process and the new report card, proposing a change to tri-mesters. This new report card transitions to the Webster Middle School model. There will be a parent roll-out meeting. Mr. Zajac answered questions regarding the transition from number to letter grades. There will be a student meeting this week. A committee will be working to finalize the new report card. Will hold informational parent meetings. He said there will be growing pains, but hopefully with enough communication we can work through it. There will also be a change in parent/teacher conferences – not doing the student led conference format this year – conferences will be held November 15 & 16.

Chairman Hurton voiced his concern regarding the quick implementation.

#### B. MCAS Results Presentation

Mrs. Daniels outlined the Next Generation MCAS, Webster students took this test on computers last Spring. A Power Point presentation was given. As Superintendent Goguen stated we can't compare achievement levels since this new test is more rigorous. A comparison was given for grades 3-8 – we are 30% below sate average for ELA and Math. Mr. Knowlton reviewed grade 10 ELA and Math results. Mr. Zajac reviewed grades 5-8 ELA and Math along with the challenges and actions to be taken. Mrs. Coleman reviewed grade 3 & 4 ELA and Math. She is excited about the growth, she reviewed PAE's challenges and action. Mrs. Goguen said there is significant work to be done; "This is only one test, let's not forget all the wonderful things being done in the District." Member Napierata is concerned with the low test scores, having gone to the DESE website, Webster is low on the list. She suggested at another meeting a presentation of on-going assessments and data of student performance be made. Chairman Hurton questioned teacher evaluation and the discrepancy in student achievement. Mrs. Goguen said this is the beginning of the analysis, we will look deeper at programs and resources in the district. She is confident the results will improve with the new reading program. Building principals have the task of ensuring teachers are held to a higher standard of instruction.
