#### >> WHAT WE ARE PROPOSING



The Bridgewater - Raritan Regional School District will request funding for DISTRICT - WIDE FACILITIES RENOVATION PROJECTS to include potential INFRASTRUCTURE and CLASSROOM RENOVATION PROJECTS and ADDITIONS via a Referendum Vote on March 14, 2023.

#### REFERENDUM IS BEING PROPOSED IN TWO QUESTIONS:

- » QUESTION #1 ZERO TAX IMPACT
  - Comprised of all Capital / Educational & Facilities Infrastructure Projects & a Cafeteria Addition at Bradley Gardens.
- » QUESTION #2 TAX IMPACT

Comprised of a Middle School Addition and Renovations which would allow for a 6th Grade re-alignment resulting in a traditional 6, 7, 8 Middle School and also free up space at the primary schools to allow for the implementation of a Full Day Kindergarten Program. Renovations at the Primary schools is also included, creating appropriate Kindergarten Classrooms.

→ FUTURE QUESTION NOV. 2023 - OPERATING COSTS Costs to support additional staffing and operational costs associated with full-day kindergarten and grade re-alignment.

#### >> WHAT WOULD BE DONE

The proposed Referendum would provide much needed facilities upgrades and renovations that would allow our facilities to support an exciting and progressive curriculum. Projects include:

#### **SECURITY MEASURES**

- » Provide new secure vestibules at building entrances including Administrative Office upgrades.
- » Provide secure lock down capabilities (doors & hardware).
- » Provide clock/speaker and critical communications systems.

## RENOVATIONS TO AUDITORIUM, SCIENCE/STEM LABS, LOCKER ROOMS, CAFETORIUMS

» Instructional space upgrades to support a growing and challenging curriculum and provide an exciting, efficient educational environment for students and staff alike.

#### REPLACEMENT OF WINDOWS SYSTEMS

- » Replace operationally failing/unrepairable window systems.
- » Install safety glazing on lower level windows being replaced and safety film on other windows.

#### **ROOFING REPLACEMENT/REPAIRS**

» Provide much needed replacement of leaking and deteriorated roofing systems and flashings.

#### **MECHANICAL & PLUMBING SYSTEM UPGRADES**

- » Replace older rooftop and unit ventilator units to provide proper ventilation, heating, air conditioning and controls.
- » Boiler Replacement and address sanitary piping.

#### **TOILET ROOM RENOVATIONS/UPGRADES**

» Renovate and upgrade existing toilet rooms including finishes, fixtures, and partitions.

#### **ELECTRICAL & LIGHTING UPGRADES**

»Upgrade limited lighting with new LED systems.

#### **HAZARDOUS MATERIALS ABATEMENT**

» Remove asbestos flooring at select locations.

#### SITE PROJECTS

- » Replace damaged asphalt & concrete walkways & curbs.
- » Improve and provide ADA Accessibility to each facility.
- » Add railings and ramps to assist with accessibility.
- » Widen certain driveways/bus loop to provide safer access.

#### **CAFETERIA ADDITION (BRADLEY GARDENS)**

» Provide needed core space at Bradley Gardens.

#### MIDDLE SCHOOL ADDITION

- » Bring 6th grade back for a traditional 6-8 Middle School.
- » Free up classroom space at Primary Schools for a Full Day Kindergarten Program.
- » Renovate Primary Schools to accommodate Kindergarten classrooms.

#### >> WHY NOW?



- » While the Board of Education and Administration have successfully addressed many facility needs over the years, the amount of work necessary cannot be completed within the operating budget; WE NEED TO DO MORE...
- » We are dealing with aging schools, (OLDEST = 61 YEARS OLD) Some with original windows, doors, and other infrastructure items that have reached the end of their life expectancy.
- » Current INTEREST RATES are on the rise and we'd like to secure the rate while still somewhat reasonable.
- » The District has been approved for 33% DEBT SERVICE AID on eligible projects. This means MILLIONS in savings for Bridgewater-Raritan!
- » CURRENT DEBT SERVICE AID PAYMENTS ARE ENDING and therefore, the new debt being assumed under the March Referendum, won't be adding to an already existing debt.

#### STATE FUNDING/DEBT SERVICE AID

Up to 34% of all eligible costs. The District has been approved for \$42.2 Million in State Aid that will offset project costs if the Referendum passes. This debt service aid is only available to the taxpayers through the passage of the Referendum; projects completed out of capital reserve are NOT eligible for funding.
