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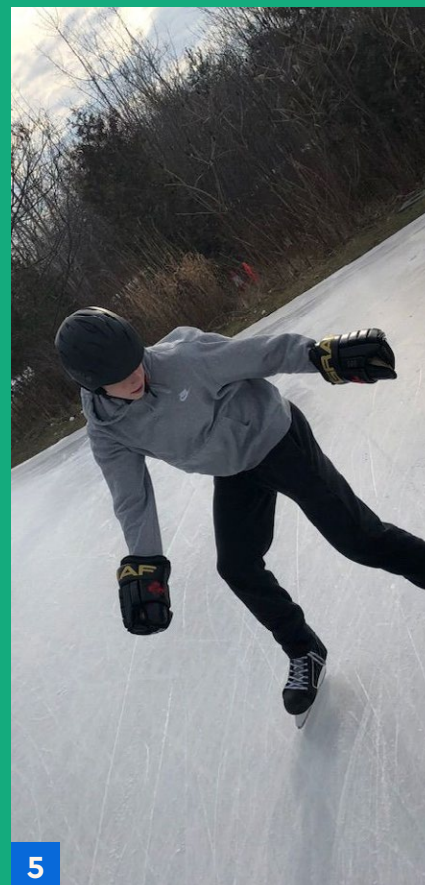

STUDENT-LED CAFÉ LAUNCH

(Introduction to entrepreneurship)



Food service is a welcome addition to the KCS Senior School. Among all the benefits, one that might come as a surprise is student entrepreneurship.

Thanks to the mindset and life skills it exercises, entrepreneurship is part of what all students will experience at the KCS Senior School. It is also officially underway in our student-led café.

All grade 10s were challenged to launch the café. In Path and their Careers course, they:

- were introduced to entrepreneurship, corporate social responsibility, and the various elements of a thoughtful venture: value proposition, customer segments, key resources, key partners, cost structure, revenue streams, and more.
- helped create a customer research survey and analyzed the results to create a menu, determine café hours, and make choices regarding pricing and other customer preferences.

- held a soft launch for the grades 9s and staff, serving homemade crepes, cookies, chicken nuggets, chocolate milk, and lemonade.
- had a workshop with Lucas Chang of [Y2 Entrepreneurship Labs](#) to reflect on the launch, make adjustments, and engage in price modelling that would calculate per-unit cost.

With the addition of the Café Club, interested grade 9 and 10 students have signed up to staff the café, currently every Friday at lunch. The grade 10s will continue to oversee the business, monitoring revenue and costs, and making adjustments as needed. We all get to enjoy the buzz of a café, mouth-watering aromas, and a convenient availability of delicious food and drink in our Market Place.



KCS By Design is a distinct leadership program that all students engage in each week.

In September, students joined committees where they would play a role in shaping the school experience in one of the following areas: academics, arts, athletics, citizenship, and spirit.

While the process can vary by group, here's how their leadership generally unfolds:

- brainstorming big ideas on a challenge or opportunity that members within each committee want to address
- deciding as a group if they wish to work together on one idea or subdivide to work on more than one
- beginning research on the idea(s), including the possibility of interviewing experts to learn more
- engaging in an [8-in-8 brainstorming exercise](#) to generate a large number of potential ways to address the chosen challenge
- sharing the top ideas from the 8-in-8 and engage in a multi-voting exercise to see where interest and support among the group land
- identifying, figuring out, and executing on the chosen idea(s)

Here's an article sharing the story of [last year's KCS By Design experience](#), when our founding students chose to help address water pollution. This year's students have identified several worthy areas of leadership to explore, including the design of our unfinished space, introducing Arts Week, and taking steps to address human rights, health care, and civic literacy. We look forward to sharing progress in future updates.
