

The board of trustees of Parma School District No.137 is authorized by law to adopt policy for its governance and makes reasonable efforts to ensure that its policy manual is accurate and in full compliance with all applicable laws. This policy manual is intended to provide guidance and interpretation of current law in conformity with local, state, and federal laws and regulations.

The policy manual does not and will not be interpreted as providing additional rights beyond those granted by current law.

Any term or provision within these policies found to be prohibited by law or unenforceable will be ineffective to the extent of such prohibition or unenforceability without, to the extent reasonably possible, invalidating the remainder of the policy or policy manual. All other terms, provisions, and policies will have full force and effect and will not be affected thereby.

Any term or provision within these policies found to be in conflict or inconsistent with current law will be superseded by current law. All other terms, provisions, and policies will have full force and effect and will not be affected thereby.

Clerical mistakes in the policy manual and errors arising from oversight or omission may be corrected by the board or authorized representative at any time at its own initiative. Such mistakes will not invalidate the force and effect of an individual policy or the policy manual.

The superintendent and his or her staff will inform the board when policies are determined to be needed, draft the policies for the board, provide advice and guidance regarding how proposed policies would affect the schools or educational programs within the district, and make changes as designated by the board prior to final adoption.

Proposals for new policies or changes to existing policies may be initiated in writing by any board member or any administrative employee of the board. Such proposals will be referred to the superintendent for review prior to board action on the proposal.

Policies and policy revisions will be reviewed by the board, but will not be adopted until a subsequent meeting. However, temporary approval may be granted by the board to meet emergency conditions or special events that may occur before formal action can be taken by the board. The board, at its discretion, may receive public input prior to adopting policy.

Policies adopted or amended will be made a part of the minutes of the meeting in which the action occurred and will also be included in the district's policy manual.
