

**Citizenship Agreement**  
**Wright City High School**  
**A+ Schools Program**

1. All A+ students begin each school year with zero discipline points.
2. Each disciplinary referral that results in an in-school or out-of-school suspension takes away from the student's positive discipline standing.

**In-school suspension results in a three point penalty for each day assigned.**

**Out-of-school suspension results in a four point penalty for each day assigned.**

3. The accumulation of forty-one (41) points during any one school year will result in the revocation of the A+ student's positive discipline standing and they will be removed from the A+ program.

Students who commit any of the following offenses will be removed from the A+ program as well:

1. Arson
  2. Possession/ Use of Alcohol
  3. Possession/ Use of a Weapon
  4. Possession/ Use of a Controlled Substance
  5. Sale/Distribution of Controlled Substance
  6. Sexual Assault
4. If a student is removed from the program, the coordinator will notify the student and parents in writing. This notice will include a statement of the disciplinary reason the student was disqualified and the facts constituting the disqualification.

A student or parent/guardian may request to appeal the disqualification from the A+ program.

A hearing with the A+ Appeals Committee will be held within ten (10) calendar days of a written request presented to the A+ coordinator by the student or parent/guardian. The Appeals Committee will be comprised of the A+ coordinator, a counselor, and a teacher, all appointed by the A+ coordinator. The committee's decision will be made in writing to the student and the parent/guardian of the offending student within ten (10) calendar days of the hearing.

(OVER)

To appeal a decision of the Appeals Committee, the student or parent/guardian of the offending student may contact the A+ coordinator in writing within ten (10) days of the decision made by the Appeals Committee to announce a further appeal to the building principal. The A+ coordinator will provide notice of the appeal to the building principal along with a copy of the reason for disqualification. The building principal will review the findings of the Appeals Committee and the appeal made by the student or student's parent/guardian and issue a ruling within ten (10) days.

To appeal a decision of the building principal, the student or parent/guardian of the offending student may contact the A+ coordinator in writing within ten (10) days of the decision made by the building principal to announce a further appeal to the superintendent. The A+ coordinator will provide notice of the appeal to the superintendent along with a copy of the reason for disqualification. The superintendent will review the findings of the Appeals Committee, the building principal, and the appeal made by the student or student's parent/guardian and issue a ruling within ten (10) days.

To appeal a decision of the superintendent, the student or parent/guardian of the offending student may contact the A+ coordinator in writing within ten (10) days of the decision made by the superintendent to announce a further appeal to the Board of Education. The A+ coordinator will provide notice of the appeal to the Board along with a copy of the reason for disqualification. The Board or the Board's committee will hear the student's appeal in closed session within twenty (20) working days of having received the notice of appeal. The Board will notify the student of its decision in writing within ten (10) working days of hearing the appeal.
