WHAT IS APPLY TEXAS?

- Apply Texas was created to provide a centralized means for both Texas and Non-Texas students to apply to various institutions available in our state.
- www.applytexas.org
- Applications open on August 1st each year
- You are not committing to anything, just giving yourself options

WHAT YOU NEED

- Your Social Security # (your HS counselor may be able to get this for you)
- You must be able to verify your email address
- Knowledge of parent's educational background
- Accurately state if you do/don't have college credits
 - Dual Credit students still enter as "Freshman"
- **WRITE DOWN** your log in information



- FREE APPLICATION FOR FEDERAL STUDENT AID
 - The first step in applying for financial aid
 - A snapshot of your family's financial situation
 - Helps determine your eligibility for most federal and state aid
 - Each FAFSA covers ONE academic year
- Always Free
- Opens October 1st every year








TYPES OF FINANCIAL AID




WHAT IS AN FSA ID?

- Federal Student Aid Identification
- Your electronic signature
- Username and password
- Student and one parent will each create their own
- Will be used each year to renew your FAFSA
- Use your personal email account

Account Recovery

Only a verified email address OR a verified mobile phone number is required, but if you provided both on previous screens, you MUST verify both below.

- If you used an email address **and** a mobile number, verify them one at a time
- Retrieve the message from your inbox and enter the secure code into your FSA ID application
- Verify your cell number after FSA sends you a text with a secure code

WHAT YOU NEED

- Your (and/or your parent's) 2021 tax information – FAFSA always asks about income earned TWO YEARS prior to the year you'll be receiving financial aid
- If you're a dependent student your parent(s) will also need to supply
 - Month and year of their marriage, separation, or divorce
 - New worth of current investments
 - Other income, including untaxed
 - Housing, food, or other allowances received
 - Total child support received/paid in 2021

HELPFUL FAFSA TIPS

- Accuracy is important
 - Use no punctuation when entering your name – only a hyphen if there's one of your Social Security or Permanent Resident Card
- If you're not currently living with a parent or legal guardian and you are homeless, or self-supporting and at risk at being homeless, provide
 - The mailing address of a relative or friend OR
 - The address at one of the offices at the college you plan to attend (ask the school first)
- Even if you have Dual Credit or AP credits, you are still a 1st year college student

DEPENDENT STUDENTS: WHICH PARENT?

Parent(s)' Marital Status	Which One(s) Do I Report?
Married	Both
Biological parents live together, but are not married	Both
Divorced or separated, but living in same house	Both

Parent(s)' Marital Status	Which One?
Divorced/separated, living apart	The parent you lived with most in last 12 months & step-parent if remarried
If you lived with your divorced/separated parents equally over last 12 months	The parent who gave you the most financial support in last 12 months & step-parent if remarried
Parent is widowed	Report income for only the surviving parent, even if parents filed a joint return in 2021

IRS DATA RETRIEVAL TOOL (DRT)

- Allows for certain tax return information to be transferred from the IRS database
 - Information must be entered EXACTLY as it was when filing taxes
- Participation is voluntary and student chooses whether to transfer data to FOTW
- IRS will authenticate taxpayer's identity
- If tax record is found, IRS transfers information to populate the FAFSA
- Reduces documents requested by financial aid office

FREQUENT FAFSA ERRORS

- Social Security Numbers
- Divorced/widowed/remarried parental information
- Income earned by parent/stepparent
- Untaxed income
- U.S. income taxes paid
- Household size
- Number of household members in college
- Real estate and investment net worth


MAKING CORRECTIONS

- Using FAFSA on the Web, if student has a FSA ID;
- Updating paper SAR; or
- Submitting documentation to college's financial aid office.
