Reading books with your child can be a great way to connect while helping them learn valuable lessons. Author of *The Read-Aloud Handbook* Jim Trelease says in this article "<u>Don't Stop Reading to Your Kids Once They Learn How to Read</u>" "If you read a book about a kid who gets in trouble by hanging out with the wrong crowd, your child is going to experience that directly, and she's going to experience it with you at her side, and you can talk about it together. You can ask questions like: 'Do you think the boy made the right choice?' 'Do you think that girl was really her friend?' When you talk about a book together, it's not a lecture, it's more like a coach looking at a film with his players, going over the plays to find out what went right and what went wrong."


