

Manchester 2023 Scholarships

**All scholarships due by Thursday, March 23rd unless noted*

1. Manchester High School Educators Scholarship – Minimum 3.2 G.P.A. Involvement in at least two school clubs (other than those where varsity letter earned). Essay.
2. Robert H. Hauenstein Scholarship – \$250. Minimum 2.8 G.P.A. Student who has displayed a great deal of effort rather than just a high G.P.A.
3. Jamie M. Wolfe Memorial Art Scholarship – Two years of art at the high school and display a love of art by participation in extra-curricular school related art activities.
4. Carl M. Arnold Scholarship – Must have attended Manchester Middle School for at least one year, an interest and ability in music, good citizenship and consideration of others. \$1,500 **(Renewable for 2 years)**
5. Manchester Senior Panther Tennis Scholarship – \$200 Must have participated in varsity tennis and based on attitude, G.P.A., financial need, and college plans.
6. Benjamin Smith Scholarship – \$2,000. Preference given to a senior pursuing a degree in the health professions with good attendance and volunteer hours.
7. Teacher Memorial Scholarships – Manchester seniors with a 3.25 G.P.A. Involvement in school or community service. \$1,500 **(Renewable for 2 years)**
8. Manchester Science Club Scholarship – Science club members only with minimum 3.0 G.P.A.
9. Manchester National Honor Society Scholarships – (Scholarship available for non-members of N.H.S.) Student must be planning to attend college and have taken a college prep or advanced class in high school.
10. Manchester Class of 1989 Memorial Scholarship – \$400. Based on school and community involvement along with academic performance.
11. Manchester American Legion Post 739 Scholarships – \$500 to three qualified Manchester seniors who will attend college.
12. Class of 2016 Perseverance Scholarship – Given to a senior student that plans on attending a 2- or 4-year college. 3.4 or higher GPA required. Student must have faced a hardship in life or helped others during time of hardship. Essay required.
13. The Gilbert T. & Evelyn M. Nolley Scholarship – Awarded annually to three Manchester seniors. Amount varies between \$500-\$1,000 yearly. **(Renewable for four years)**
14. Manchester Alumni Association Scholarship – Criteria includes an excellent academic record, leadership ability, school and community involvement, and a written essay. \$500 **(Renewable for 4 years.)**

15. M.E.A. Nolley Scholarship – Based on scholastic ability, desire, and need. Students must write letter describing why they are deserving. \$500 (**Renewable for 3 years.**)
16. Nichols Legacy Scholarship – \$1,000. Student must have a documented learning disability by the school system. Student must have shown continued improvement throughout high school and plan on attending college or trade school.
17. Bryan G. Nowak Memorial Scholarship – \$800. Must have been in marching band, concert band, choir or Singers and involved in plays or musicals. This senior must display a love of music or theater, as well as, good citizenship.
18. James R. France Football Scholarship – Up to \$1,000. Senior lettermen and member current year's football team; must successfully complete one semester of college or vocational training.
19. Joseph A. Ashley Memorial Scholarship – \$1,000 to two seniors. Essay. Good citizenship and involvement in school activities.
20. Portage Lakes Kiwanis Club Scott Shookman Scholarship – \$1,500 to two Manchester seniors. Based on service to school and community, educational goals, and financial need.
21. OAPSE Scholarship – \$400. 2.8 GPA minimum, student has taken part in extra-curricular activities, first consideration will be given to students who are relatives of OAPSE members.
22. Marcia C. White Memorial Scholarship – Up to two \$1,500 awards given for students with good citizenship, involvement in school activities, and a love for literature and/or writing. Essay required.
23. Richard J. Kaderly Memorial Scholarship – \$1,000. Criteria includes a student that shows Active citizenship in the community, above average grades, participation in school activities and is planning to attend a 2- or 4- year college or university.
24. Manchester Transportation Scholarship – \$100. Criteria includes 2.8 GPA, a student who has displayed a great deal of effort throughout high school, and completed application.
25. Manchester Education Foundation – \$500. Five scholarships available for students who possess a desire to achieve. 2.8 G.P.A. required. Students must plan on attending college, trade programs, or an apprenticeship.
26. Nolley 3rd Grade Scholarship – Student must create a unique poem explaining why money is important. Students must be attending college in the fall.
27. Julius Lynn Minniti Scholarship – GPA of 2.8 or higher. Given out to one student and paid directly to the college/university. Amount varies but can be up to **full tuition**.
28. Manchester Youth Basketball Association - \$500. Two scholarships available: one for a senior girl and one for a boys' basketball player. Athlete must have 3.0 GPA or higher and be attending college, trade school, or military in the fall. Two letters of recommendation due with application. ***(Deadline: April 7th)**

29. Timothy J. Stevehagen Memorial Scholarship – Awards to students that display good citizenship and involvement within the school and/or the community. Essay.
30. Shannon Swaino Memorial Scholarship – \$1,000. 3.0 or higher GPA, involved in at least two varsity sports. Applicant should have high moral character, community involvement and display potential financial need. Essay and letter of recommendation from a current or previous coach required.
31. Junior Women’s Civic Club – \$2,000. Female students who are residents or Summit or Medina counties. Based on financial need and volunteer service. 2.5 G.P.A. ***(Deadline: March 31st)**
32. Summit County Master Gardener - \$1,000 to four Summit county students enrolling in 2 or 4-year program in horticultural, agricultural, or environmental studies. Apply online at www.akroncf.org/scholarshipapps ***(Deadline: April 15th)**
33. Ohio Gas Association – \$1,000. 3.0 or higher GPA, attending an Ohio college, technical, or trade school. Must have career goal in crude oil and natural gas industry or energy related field. ***(Deadline: March 31st)**
34. Akron Amateur Softball Association- \$1,000. Given to 3 summit county softball athletes. Must have 3.0 GPA and lettered for 2 seasons. Essay. ***(Deadline: May 1st)**
35. Hudec Dental Scholarship – Amounts ranging from \$1,000-\$2,500 for college bound seniors from NE Ohio. 3.0 GPA. Essay. Apply online www.hudecdental.com/scholarship. ***(Deadline: March 31st)**
36. Barberton Rotary Club Scholarship – \$1,000. Students who are positive role models. Must include teacher recommendations. A minimum GPA of 3.25 or in the top 25% of the graduating class. Financial need and/or service to the community will be considered. ***(Deadline: March 16th)**
37. Lynn Stamp Conservation Scholarship – \$1,000. GPA of greater than 3.25. Students with volunteer hours of service involving the environment and/or Portage Lakes area and who plan to major in environmental studies or related fields.
38. Summit County Sports Hall of Fame – \$1,000 Must have a varsity letter in a sport. 3.00 G.P.A. Must have recommendation submitted by coach or athletic director. Apply on-line at www.summitcountyhof.com. ***(Deadline: April 3rd)**
39. Berkshire Hathaway-Dream...Innovate...Grow-Scholarship – 3.0 or higher GPA, accepted as a full-time college student for 2022, leadership, volunteerism and positive attitude. Essay-500 words. ***(Deadline: March 1st)**
40. Consumers National Bank Homer Unkefer Agricultural Scholarship – \$1,000. Minimum GPA of 3.0 and majoring in a 2- or 4-year agricultural curriculum. ***(Deadline: March 31st)**
