6th Grade Elective Options

- Students will take one elective.
 - EXCEPTION: Students taking Honors/GT Language Arts will have two electives.
- All electives are year-long courses.
- First choice of elective will be marked in Skyward (and your course selection worksheet). Your second, third, and fourth choices of electives will be marked as alternates.

Fine Arts Courses

BAND

In CCISD, band provides students the opportunity to experience the joy of learning and performing a woodwind, brass, or percussion instrument. Band instruments include flute, oboe, bassoon, clarinet, saxophone, trumpet, French horn, trombone, euphonium, tuba, and percussion (drums/keyboard). In band, students will learn to pursue excellence in both an individual and ensemble (group) setting. As the student develops, they will have opportunities to perform music of all types of genres in a variety of settings, including concert band, marching band, full orchestra, musicals, jazz band, drumline, wind and percussion ensembles, solos, and more.

CHOIR

In CCISD, choir welcomes all students interested in learning how to sing and use their voices. In beginning choir, students learn healthy vocal technique, including how to navigate their changing adolescent voices. In the sixth grade year, students are taught the basics of healthy singing, music-reading, and how to be a part of a vocal ensemble. As such, it is strongly encouraged that students begin their choir journey in sixth grade. In choir, students will sing in large and small ensembles as well as be provided opportunities to sing solos (if they choose). Throughout their time in choir, students will study and perform in a variety of music genres including classical, acapella singing, musical theater, jazz, and pop music.

ORCHESTRA

In CCISD, orchestra allows students to learn an instrument from the string family including the brilliant sounds of the viola and violin and the mellow sounds of the cello and bass. Students will learn to sharpen their instrumental technique, ability to read music, and play as part of an ensemble. Over the course of the student's musical development, there will be opportunities to learn and perform music in many styles, including classical, pop/rock, and more with performances in large and small groups as well as individual opportunities.

Fine Arts Courses

THEATRE


CCISD offers a comprehensive theatrical education that provides a multitude of creative outlets for students on the stage. Whether they prefer to be in the booth or in the spotlight, there is a place for every kind of talent in the theatre. Every secondary campus in CCISD offers a variety of theatre classes for all levels of experience. Students at P.H. Greene Elementary, a STEAM campus, receive theatre once a week in addition to art and music. The theatre departments perform for thousands of community members every year, and the Thespian Clubs are long-time supporters of community events and multiple charities.

VISUAL ART

In CCISD, the visual arts provide students with the opportunity to express themselves inventively through a variety of media and techniques. Every K-5 student in the district receives art instruction from a certified teacher, and every secondary campus offers multiple visual arts courses for students of all levels of experience. The visual art department connects with our community through public exhibitions, community events like Imagination Celebration, and campus events. Students from CCISD have been honored with local, state, and national awards.

Leadership Development Corps (LDC)

The Leadership Development Corps is a Clear Creek ISD initiative founded in 1996, designed to foster selfdiscipline, a positive self-concept, and a winning attitude in students who are already generally motivated. Topics of study include introduction to leadership and character and citizenship education, military customs, and courtesies, organization skills, health and fitness, and life-saving skills.



PE Waivers

- A student who participates in an individual sport outside of school for a minimum of 5 hours per week, may apply for a PE waiver.
- The application deadline to obtain a PE waiver for the Fall of 2023 is **May 5, 2023**.
- Applications are available at **ccisd.net** and must be emailed or returned to the District Athletic Office.





Skyward Student Access

Students will log in from the CCISD home page. Go to www.ccisd.net (1), click "Logins" (2) and then click "Skyward Family Access" (3)





This will bring the students to the CCISD Skyward Login screen.

Students will login with their CCISD Student ID and Password.

The student credentials MUST be used to log in. The Course Requests process is not active under the Parent's Login. Once the Login ID and Password has been entered, click the "Sign In" button to log into site.






IF the student receives the "Pop-Up Blocker Warning" screen, click the "Retry" button to bypass the pop-up blocker.






To request courses for 2023-2024 school year, click the "Schedule" tab (1) on the left. Notice the screen shows "Course Requests now open" (2). To start entering the requests, click the "Request Courses for 2023-2024 in Campus" (3) link.






Student Entering Course Request

To search for a course, enter the course number on the search line, then click the "Search" button (1). Once the course shows under "Available Courses for 2023-2024", highlight the course (2) and click the "Add Course" button (3).






HELPFUL TIP: If you click on the actual course name, a balloon will appear showing the "Class Info" for the course.





Click the "Clear" button to reset and search for next course. Repeat process for adding more courses.




Continue the process until you have reached 7 CREDITS including Language Arts, Social Studies, Math, Science, PE/LDC, and top elective choice



Student Entering Alternate Request

Click the "Request Alternates" tab (1). You will add courses to "Selected Alternate Courses" the same way you added the requests. To search for a course, enter the course number on the search line, then click the "Search" button (2). Highlight the course (3) and click the "Add Course" button (4).






The alternate course will be displayed under the "Selected Alternate Courses".

Click the "Clear" button (1) to reset and repeat search process for adding more alternate courses. Notice the "R" meaning requested and the "1" meaning alternate course order (2). The arrows are used to move the Alternates to a different order for priority. This does NOT mean the student will automatically get the 1st alternate listed during the scheduling process.


Students will see the "Total Requests/Scheduled" selected, "Total Alternates" selected and "Total Credits" of Requests displayed above the Selected Alternate Courses (3).

Option to print the requests is available by clicking the print icon (4).



Important Course Registration Reminders:

Choose courses carefully. Schedule changes can have a significant impact of the calculation of a students nine-week average. Schedule changes will only be considered during the first five days of class for specific reasons (see Intermediate EPG page 9).



Important Course Registration Reminders:


- Parents will have the opportunity to view their selected courses in skyward the week of April 10, 2023. The Intermediate campus will communicate how to request any corrections.
- Students must enter their 2023-2024 course requests ONLINE using their SKYWARD STUDENT ACCESS account and turn in their course selection worksheet to your elementary campus by Friday, February 21, 2023.

Please make sure to enter alternate elective requests so that the campus can use them when/if needed.

Grading




Grading in CCISD:

Elementary Standards Based Grading

- Communicates proficiency level on specific state standards
- Multiple topics assessed and reported in each subject area
- Work habits and behaviors listed separately
- Allows learners to set and reach incremental goals

Secondary Traditional Grading

- Assigns grades including daily work and major grades
- Grades are averaged for each grading period and the semester,
- 100-point grading scale with a passing standard of 70%.



Considerations for Honors/GT Coursework



Benefits of Honors/GT Coursework:

- All Honors courses have open enrollment and student are encouraged to reap the benefits of rigorous coursework.
- Honors courses will assist students in acquiring the deep and complex thinking skills needed to be successful in rigorous coursework in high school and college.
- Students will apply increasingly sophisticated thinking, reading, writing, listening, and speaking skills.
- An Honors classroom is different---there is a priority on deep and complex discussions, rigorous learning, real-world application, across content connections, and clear and persuasive writing.


Considerations for Honors/GT Coursework:

INTERMEDIATE MATH COURSE PATHWAYS TO ALGEBRA I


CCISD Intermediate Math Course Pathways to Algebra 1




Note* Students are required to be concurrently enrolled in Intermediate Honors Algebra 1 if taking Honors Biology.

Note** Students who take On Level Grade 7 Math are required to take Grade 8 Math Credit by Examination and pass with a score of 80 or above to enroll in Honors Intermediate Algebra 1 Intermediate. Refer to page 7 of the Intermediate Educational Planning Guide for Credit by Examination information.

Considerations for Honors/GT Coursework:

To enroll in Algebra I Honors/GT and Biology Honors/GT in 8th grade, students should consider these courses in 6th and 7th grade:


- 11621H Mathematics: Grade 6 Honors/GT (recommended)
- 11631H Science: Grade 6 Honors/GT (recommended)
- The curriculum in these courses is both accelerated and compacted.
- Students in Grade 6 Honors/GT math and science will be learning 7th grade curriculum.
- 11721H Mathematics: Grade 7 Honors/GT (recommended)
- 11731H Science: Grade 7 Honors/GT (recommended)
- The curriculum in these courses is both accelerated and compacted.
- Students in Grade 7 Honors/GT math and science will be learning 8th grade curriculum.



Course Level Change Procedures:

Intermediate EPG page 9

- A course level change will only be considered at the first progress report and at the end of the first nine weeks grading period of the semester for each course that offers a different level of the same course.
- Student must have attended tutorials, completed work, and had a conference with the teacher.
- Parent conference is required.
- Student must have a grade below 75 on the first progress report or at the end of the first nine weeks grading period.
- Space availability in the receiving course will be a consideration for a course-level change.
- Make your course level choices carefully!



Schedule Change Requests:

Intermediate EPG page 9

Schedule change requests can have a significant impact on the calculation of the nine-week average.

Schedule changes will be considered during the first 5 days of class for the following reasons only:

- 1. Student has already earned credit for a course in which he/she is currently scheduled.
- 2. Student does not have the pre-requisite (s) for a class listed on his/her schedule.
- 3. Student has previously failed course with the same teacher.
- 4. Student has been dismissed from a program where approval must be granted for placement.
- 5. Student does not have a full schedule.
- 6. Data entry error (no lunch, class listed twice, free period, etc.) has occurred.
- 7. Student needs remedial coursework for state assessment graduation requirements
- 8. A class is listed that the student did not request.
