From the Principal's Desk

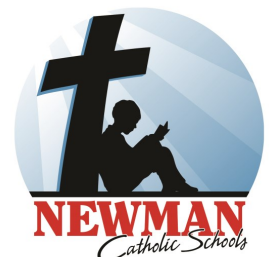
Dear Parents,

Catholic Schools Week

During the week of January 30- February 3 we will celebrate our Catholic Schools and what a blessing it is to be part of a Catholic School community. We thank our parish families, parents, and school staff for making this opportunity possible. Please refer to the schedule of events for our special days. Keep in mind that not all of our schools have the same activities scheduled and that things might be just a little different for a number of reasons. The classroom teachers will share this directly with you in their weekly communication.

Lent

The liturgical season of Lent will begin on Ash Wednesday, February 22. Our school community will participate by being marked with ashes and by observing traditional Lenten practices.

Conferences

Conferences will be held on February 7 and 16. These will be optional and both parents and teachers may request to have a conference. The teachers will send home a link to that you can sign up if you wish and they will also let you know if they would like to see you for a conference.

Valentine's Day

We will celebrate Valentine's Day on Tuesday, February 14. Students will be allowed to bring valentines for their classmates if they choose to do so, but should bring one for all classmates if doing so.

No School

There will be no school on Monday, February 20.

Saint John Henry Newman's Birthday

February 21 is the birthday of our namesake. The school children will celebrate by learning more about this holy man of prayer through activities and the study of his life along with

some of the prayers that he wrote.

School Safety Notes

Please remember that the Circle Drive and coned off area on the west side are not parking areas. In the morning before school and in the afternoon after school, the vehicles are to keep moving. No cars should be left unattended. Please stay in your vehicle. If you need to help your children out of the car, perhaps this isn't the place for you to drop off and pick up. You might consider parking in the parking lot or on the street and walking your children to the door. I know that car seats can present a challenge. Please pull your car forward and stay to the right as you stop to let your child in or out. The left lane is for you to exit the area. Children should not be getting in and out in the left lane. Some students exit the building on the north end, but this is not an area where children will walk to the car by themselves. If you plan to pick them up there, where you park is up to you, but please get out of your vehicle and walk towards the area so the supervisor can see you. The children will not be dismissed to walk to the vehicle if we do not have eyes on you for safety reasons. Thank you. No children should be on the playground after school without parental supervision. Please write a note to the teacher or childcare supervisor if you have given permission for your child to go home with another parent/student or someone other than the usual person who picks them up. If you forget, just give us a call or send an email by 1:30 that day. Walking to and from the school during the winter requires special attention to avoid slipping and falling. We pride ourselves in the fact that snow is removed in a timely manner and sidewalks and entrances are monitored and maintained throughout the day. Our playground and parking lots are plowed before school starts for the day. With all this being said, these areas may still be slippery. We ask that you be aware of conditions and please be careful!

We continue to practice our safety drills. We have multiple drills planned for February. Please engage in conversation with your children about safety plans in general.

Cold and Rainy Days/Building Access

On days when the wind chill is below 0 or the play areas are too wet you will see signs on the doors and the supervisors will not be outside at 7:30. That is a signal that students are to come inside. Students can enter via the NW recess doors and the front doors of school by the circle drive by buzzing in. Please be aware that the north doors do not allow entry and that the church doors are not a school entry. K-1-2-3 go to the cafeteria and 4-5 go to South Hall.

Attendance

Just a reminder that school starts at 7:45 and the second bell rings at 7:55. That is when students are to be in their seats and ready for the day. School attendance is absolutely critical and has a direct impact on student performance. Even being ten minutes late, puts the student at a disadvantage with routines that start the day. Attendance matters. See Wis. Stat. sec. 118.15, and School Attendance Enforcement, Wis. Stat. sec. 118.16 for more information.

Art News

This past month in art we have been focusing on Kinetic Art, which is art that shows movement. Our pieces include moving handprint antlers on reindeer for kindergarten, 1st grade is making moving head walruses with a brad fastener to create movement. 2nd grade created a variety of facial expressions on a paper strip to pull through their snowmen. 3rd grade made characters on sleds or tubes, attaching them to a pull tab to show them gliding down a hill. 4th grade made folktale tree dioramas, then drew a figure skater and attached it to a paperclip. Placing a magnet below the diorama allowed the ice skater to appear to be skating in a scene. 5th grade is drawing a snowboarder face with helmet and goggles. The goggles are cutout and behind is a spinning wheel with a reflection of what the snowboarder is looking at. As the wheel spins, it gives a different view out of the snowboarder's goggles. I'm proud of all the hard work and creativity our artists are putting into their work. Next up will be some fun mini lessons for Valentines day.

Computer Lab News

The computer lab has been a very busy place! It is fun to listen to our Kindergarten students giggle as they continue to discover the excitement of our KidPix software! They have worked on several mini projects using the tools they have learned, and they will continue to do so throughout third quarter. Students also continue to practice keyboarding once a week and are making good progress. Practicing at home would strengthen their skills even more! Animal riddle books are being created by our first graders as they show off their KidPix and Microsoft Word skills. Our second and third graders are now learning how to create slide shows using the KidPix software. The second graders will build upon their classroom study of the planets, and the third graders will explore the rainforest. They will visit several websites to learn and research more about their topic and gather ideas to include in their projects. They will then take what they have learned and create individual pictures with facts that will ultimately be transformed into a slideshow to share with their classmates.

The fourth graders are learning the basics of PowerPoint as they create their "All About Me" project. They are doing a fantastic job and are looking forward to presenting their projects to the class! It has been so much fun learning about their interests and experiences.

Our fifth graders are beginning to research a candy of their choice in order to show off some of the more advanced features of PowerPoint they have learned.

We will then spend some time presenting these creative projects to the class!

Spanish News

¡Es febrero! It's February! How time flies! In Spanish, the kindergarteners are talking about animals, the sounds they make, where they live, and what they do. Ask, "¿Qué dice el conejo?". We will be building our vocabulary to be able to tell the story of La Gallinita Roja (The Little Red Hen), at the end of the year. In first grade, we continue to work on foods and days of the week as we work toward understanding La Oruga Muy Hambrienta (They Very Hungry Caterpillar). Second graders are working on weather words and clothing. They will be learning the tools to read Froggy Se Viste (Froggy Gets Dressed.) Third graders finish Huevos verdes con Jamón (Green Eggs and Ham) and then begin learning to tell time in Spanish. Ask them, "¿Qué hora es?". Fourth graders will be talking about families. Ask them, "¿Cómo es tu familia?". Finally, fifth graders focusing on a folk tale from Panama. Language learning tip of the month: use context to help you figure out what is being said. Just as context clues help you to understand your reading better, they will help you understand written and spoken Spanish better!

It will be on to fitness activities, team building, scooters, and games involving cooperation and teamwork. The 4th graders will take advantage of all the snow while snowshoeing this winter. Weather Related School Closing Procedures

When considering schedule changes due to inclement weather, Newman Catholic Schools (NCS) continues to take its lead from the Wausau School District (WSD) and D.C. Everest School District (DCE). Each district varies in its standards and definitions of closure. These differences can cause confusion as NCS crosses both districts. To assist in alleviating this potential confusion, a school-by-school breakdown of procedures is laid out below. Any changes to these procedures will be communicated through Constant Contact, school newsletters, etc. Be sure to read **ALL** announcements and updates to avoid missing information.

The following tools will be the standard of communication used to announce schedule changes due to inclement weather:

- **Constant Contact:** Will be sent to the parents directly affected by the schedule changes.
- **Facebook:** Visit the Newman Catholic Schools page.
- **NCS Website:** A pop-up notification will appear upon entering www.newmancatholicschools.com.
- **TV Stations:** Channel 9 (www.waow.com) and Channel 7 (www.wsaw.com)
- **Midwest Communications Radio:** 95.5 WIFC, 101.9 WDEZ, Rock 94.7, 550AM WSAU, 1390AM Fox Sports
- **Skylert Messaging:** Digital messaging sent via email, phone, and text. You can manage your Skylert Messaging through your Skyward Family Access account. **Skylert may not be the fastest method for last minute changes. Please refer to the other communication tools first.*

Delays: The definition of delay varies by district.

- **Wausau School District–Bus Delays** – This only affects students who are picked up by First Student. Students bused by First Student will be picked up based on the delayed time. Classes at NCES: St. Anne and Newman Catholic Middle/High School will continue to run on their normal schedule. Students that are dropped off, walk, or ride the city bus are expected to be at school at the regularly scheduled time. Three-year-old Preschool and 4K AM/PM classes at NCECC: St. Michael will be cancelled when busing is delayed. Unless specified differently, child care programs at NCES: St. Anne and NCECC: St. Michael will run as regularly scheduled.
- **D.C. Everest School District–School Delays** – This affects all students at NCES: St. Mark and NCECC: St. Therese. Classes at NCES: St. Mark will be delayed by two hours, following DCE. Three-year-old Preschool will be cancelled at NCES: St. Mark, and 4K AM/PM classes will be cancelled at both NCES: St. Mark and NCECC: St. Therese. Unless specified differently, child care programs at NCES: St. Mark and NCECC: St. Therese will run as regularly scheduled.

This also affects NCMS/HS students who reside in DCE and are picked up by Lamers. Busing will be delayed by two hours. Classes at NCMS/HS will continue to run on their normal schedule. Parents can choose to drop their students off to avoid delays.

School-by-School Procedures:

Newman Catholic Middle and High School (NCMS/HS)

- **Delayed Starts** – Delays only affect students riding a yellow school bus. Classes will continue to run on the normal schedule for all other students. Delayed busing is considered an excused absence. Parents can choose to drop their students off to avoid delays.
- **Early Release** – When closing early, NCMS/HS follows the WSD. All students must be picked up by the stated release time. Bused students will be picked up according to the WSD early release schedule included in this document. Pick-up times are flexible during travel delays. At times, the two public school districts do not align in their decisions to close early or at the same time; for example:
 - DCE closes early but WSD does not; this will affect DCE bused students only. In this case, parents of DCE bused students will be contacted letting them know when busses will arrive for pick-up. If parents wish for students to remain the entire day, they must arrange for transportation at the end of the day and notify the school.
 - WSD closes early but DCE does not; all students must be picked up by the stated release time. If a student who is bused from DCE does not have alternative transportation other than the bus home, parents should contact the office to discuss arrangements.
- **Closing** – NCMS/HS follows the WSD "Public and Private" closing announcements.

NCES: St. Anne

- **Delayed Starts** – Delays only affect students riding a yellow school bus. Classes will continue to run on the normal schedule for all other students. Delayed busing is considered an excused absence. Parents can choose to drop their students off to avoid delays.
- **Early Release** – When closing early, NCES: St. Anne follows the WSD. All students must be picked up by the stated release time. Bused students will be picked up according to the WSD early release schedule included in this document. Pick-up times are flexible during travel delays.
- **Closing** – NCES: St. Anne follows the WSD "Public and Private" closing announcements.
- **Before and After Care** – In the event that there is a delayed start, before care will still be available. In the event that there is an early release, after care will not be available. Additionally, if there is a closing, before and after care will not be available. At times, when inclement weather is anticipated in the evening, after school activities are canceled, and we ask that you please pick up your child from after care as soon as possible, prior to the 5:30pm closing time.

NCES: St. Mark

- **Delayed Starts** – Classes at NCES: St. Mark will be delayed by two hours, following DCE. Three-year-old Preschool and 4K AM/PM classes will be cancelled at NCES: St. Mark.
- **Early Release** – When closing early, NCES: St. Mark follows DCE. All students must be picked up by the stated release time. Bused students will be picked up according to DCE's announcement, which will be determined on the day of the early release. Pick-up times are flexible during travel delays.
- **Closing** – NCES: St. Mark follows the DCE "Public and Private" closing announcements. In the event that the WSD closes and DCE does not close, NCES: St. Mark's Three-year-old Preschool and Kindergarten-5th grade classes will be canceled for the day.
- **Wrap-Around and Before & After Care** – In the event that there is a delayed start, before care will still be available. In the event that there is an early release, after care will not be available. Additionally, if there is a closing, wrap-around and before & after care will not be available. At times, when inclement weather is anticipated in the evening, after school activities are canceled, and we ask that you please pick up your child from after care as soon as possible, prior to the 5:30pm closing time.

NCECC: St. Michael

- **Delayed Starts** – Three-year-old Preschool and 4K AM/PM classes will be cancelled at NCECC: St. Michael.
- **Early Release** – When closing early, NCECC: St. Michael follows the WSD. All students must be picked up by the stated release time. Pick-up times are flexible during travel delays.
- **Closing** – NCECC: St. Michael follows the WSD "Public and Private" closing announcements.
- **Licensed Child Care** – Delayed starts, early releases or closures may occur to ensure the safety of students, families and employees. In these rare instances, site directors will make the best decision for the safety of all, and families will be notified directly or using the standard of communication tools.

NCECC: St. Therese

- **Delayed Starts** – 4K AM/PM classes will be cancelled at NCECC: St. Therese.
- **Early Release** – When closing early, NCECC: St. Therese's 4K AM/PM classes follows DCE. All students must be picked up by the stated release time. Bused students will be picked up according to DCE's announcement, which will be determined on the day of the early release. Pick-up times are flexible during travel delays.
- **Closing** – NCECC: St. Therese's 4K AM/PM classes follows the DCE "Public and Private" closing announcements.
- **Licensed Child Care** – Delayed starts, early releases or closures may occur to ensure the safety of students, families and employees. In these rare instances, site directors will make the best decision for the safety of all, and families will be notified directly or using the standard of communication tools.

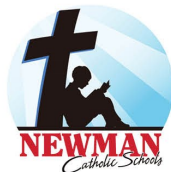
