

- I. Poquoson Athletic Hall of Fame: Board members discussed having an Athletic Hall of Fame for former, current, and future PCPS athletes who have advanced to a professional league (MBA, NFL, etc.) Questions centered around who would be included and what the cutoff would be. The main difference between each calendar centered around Winter Break. Calendar options were reviewed by a staff committee. The pre-Labor Day calendar starts with students and staff reporting back from winter break on January 2, 2024.
- IV. Athletic Travel: The Board has received several concerns regarding the switch from charter buses to school buses for athletic teams advancing to state competition. Due to the increasing number of teams making it to state-level competition, PCPS is unable to continue funding charter buses. A suggestion was made to purchase a larger charter-like bus for athletes; however, due to the overlapping VHSL competition dates, this option was not feasible.
- V. Policy 6-5.10 Instruction Materials with Sexually Explicit Content: Policy 6-5.10 was reviewed with the School Board Attorney. Written notice to Parents will be given at least 30 days prior to the use of any instructional materials with sexually explicit content. Books housed in school media centers were discussed. This policy only applies to library books if used in a classroom lesson.

PCPS would like to move forward with Warwick Mechanical Group for the PPS HVAC project. Warwick Mechanical Group has submitted a proposal for the project under the funded amount. The proposal from Warwick includes a replacement of the entire HVAC system at PPS. PCPS is able to work with Warwick through a cooperative contract with a neighboring school division. This is a change from previous plans; however, this proposal allows for us to have a complete system replacement using a VRF HVAC system whereas the previous proposal did not allow for a complete system replacement. The HVAC system at PPS will be replaced in the summer of 2023.

Subject: Motion to approve the Recommended Draft PCPS Calendar for the 2023-2024 school year.

Background

The Poquoson City School Division participates in the development of the regional calendar through its representation on the Regional Calendar Committee. This affords PCPS substantive operational efficiencies and our students' schedules coincide with the schedules of the regional programs such as New Horizons Governor's School, New Horizons Career and Technical Center, and the New Horizons Center for Autism, to the greatest extent possible. Additionally, staff, parent, student, and community feedback is elicited and considered in the development of the calendar. The school division calendar, which must be approved annually by the School Board, shall contain a minimum of 180 instructional days, contain a minimum of 140 Carnegie Units for high school courses and comply with Virginia State Code.

Discussion

Following the completion of the work of the Regional Calendar Committee, a meeting was held with the Teacher Advisory Committee (TAC), parents, students, teachers, and community members were surveyed, meetings with the school division leadership team were held, and meetings with the school based leadership teams were held; the calendar was developed with all of the input considered. All of the regional school divisions around Poquoson are electing to have a 4-day, pre-Labor day start for the 2023-2024 school year. The culmination of the information that was garnered from teachers, parents, students, and community members led to the recommendation of Poquoson also following a 4-day, pre-Labor day start. Highlights of the PCPS 2023-2024 Calendar are as follows:

- The calendar includes 180 student days, additional days for inclement weather could not be built into the calendar for the 2023-2024 school year.
- The following school holidays may be used to make up instructional time lost from inclement weather:
 - o November 10 Student Holiday (Veterans Day) for Parent-Teacher Conferences
 - November 22 Student Holiday for Thanksgiving
 - o January 15 Martin Luther King, Jr. Holiday
 - o February 19 Presidents' Day Holiday
- All four schools will have the same number of early release days, twelve (12).
- Schools will be closed to students on Friday, November 10, 2023 and will have an early dismissal on Wednesday, March 6, 2024. This will allow teachers to utilize the time for parent-teacher conferences.
- The winter break will be a full two-week break.

POLICY 6-5.10 INSTRUCTIONAL MATERIALS WITH SEXUALLY EXPLICIT CONTENT

Purpose

To establish clear procedures for schools to:

- (i) identify all instructional materials with sexually explicit content,
- (ii) ensure parental notification of any instructional materials with sexually explicit content,
- (iii) permit parents to review all instructional materials with sexually explicit content, and
- (iv) ensure alternative instructional materials, that do not include sexually explicit content, are provided in a non-punitive manner for any student whose parent so requests.

Definitions

- A. The Code of Virginia Section 2.2-2827 states that "Sexually explicit content" "means
 - (i) any description of or
 - (ii) any picture, photograph, drawing, motion picture film, digital image or similar visual representation depicting sexual bestiality, a lewd exhibition of nudity, as nudity is defined in Section 18.2-390, sexual excitement, sexual conduct or sadomasochistic abuse, as also defined in Section 18.2-390, coprophilia, urophilia, or fetishism."
- B. The Code of Virginia Section 22.1-1 defines "parent" or "parents" as "any parent, guardian, legal custodian, or other person having control or charge of a child."
- C. For the purposes of this policy, the phrases "instructional material" and "instructional materials" mean any content used by one or more students for an educational purpose, regardless of (a) its format, whether printed, representational, audiovisual, electronic, or digital (such as materials, social media content, and software applications accessible through the internet), or (b) the time, place and manner in which the content is used. Library materials are considered instructional materials when used
 - (i) for completion of an assignment, or
 - (ii) as part of an academic or extracurricular educational program. This includes any division, school, and/or classroom purchased or created assessments.

However, the phrases "instructional material" and "instructional materials" do not include standardized national or state assessments, such ACT, SAT, NAEP, and AP or SOL exams.

Identification of Instructional Materials with Sexually Explicit Content

- A. Leadership at each school, with the approval of the division superintendent, shall establish a process for identifying instructional materials with sexually explicit content.
- B. Prior to the start of the academic year, schools shall identify the specific instructional materials that include sexually explicit content which may be used during upcoming school year. When

determining whether instructional materials contain sexually explicit content, teachers, principals, and division staff should consider student age and maturity, and whether a parent might reasonably consider the instructional content harmful to their child.

Notice to Parents

- A. At least thirty (30) days prior to the use of any instructional materials with sexually explicit content, principals shall provide written notice to parents that
 - (i) specifically identifies the instructional materials with sexually explicit content,
 - (ii) informs parents of their right to review such instructional materials, and
 - (iii) informs parents of their right to have their child use, in a non-punitive manner, alternative, instructional materials that do not include sexually explicit content.
- B. Such notice should be provided in writing to parents by U.S. mail, and/or e-mail.

Parental Right to Review of Instructional Materials with Sexually Explicit Content and Right to Alternative Instructional Materials

- A. Principals shall maintain a current list of instructional materials with sexually explicit content by grade and subject on the school's public website.
- B. Principals shall provide online access for parental review of instructional materials that include sexually explicit content, unless not technically feasible or prohibited by copyright protection. Schools shall also have available at the school for parent review all instructional materials that include sexually explicit content.
- C. Schools shall defer to parents to determine whether the use of sexually explicit content in instructional materials, if any, is appropriate for their child.
- D. Upon a parent's request, schools shall provide, in a manner that is not punitive, alternative instructional materials for the student that do not include sexually explicit content.
- E. Parents may change their decision with respect to the use of alternative instructional materials by providing notice to the school.
