





Dear Parents & Guardians,

As in past years, I write with a special invitation for you to participate in a very important project here at Roman Catholic High School – our annual Continuous Improvement Survey. Did your son struggle academically the first semester? We have been running Academic Assistance Program after school since the end of the first quarter.
