Minutes	Emma Pereida-Martinez reviewed the Minutes from the April 6, 2022, meeting. They were distributed through mail to all DAC representatives prior to the meeting and presented on the PowerPoint during the meeting. A motion was made by Evelin Torres and seconded by Rocio Castro, and minutes were approved unanimously. There was no additional discussion nor were there further recommended changes or additions. Motion carried unanimously.
Public Comment	The floor was opened for public comment on items on the agenda. Mrs. Castro would like give recognition to all teachers/support staff. She has been picking up her students and other students around the district and staff has been very attentive/vigilant as to who picks up the students ensuring their safety. As promised in last month's DAC meeting, Mrs. Pereida-Martinez and Randy Flores, HR Director went to all school sites to taste the water from all filling stations. There was only one that had a sweet after taste for her personally and that was at ECR's office other than that the water seems to be tasting fine at this point.

She presented the draft of the 2022-2023 LCAP and reminded everyone that the district takes input, revises the plan, put the plan into action, and monitors the progress. There was no request for response given.</p>
LEA Federal Addendum to LCAP	<p>Emma Pereida-Martinez reviewed the purpose of each funding source and the amount received in 2021-2022 school year as well as the allocation of funds.</p> <p>Title I: supplemental support to improve student achievement including afterschool programs to support students and additional support staff (\$2,249,970 in 2021-2022).</p> <p>Title II: professional development to improve teacher quality and effectiveness (\$239,066 in 2021-2022).</p> <p>Title III: supplemental support to improve EL student achievement and English proficiency (230,373 in 2021-2022).</p> <p>Title IV: a student support and academic achievement grant to be used for well-rounded educational experiences, improving school conditions for student learning, and improving the use of technology (\$134,363).</p> <p>She asked members if there were any questions or suggestions for these federal funds and no suggestions were given and there were no questions.</p>
Williams Settlement	Emma Pereida-Martinez shared that Williams Settlement Reviews were conducted for the third trimester. The third quarterly report includes results of the School Accountability Report Card (SARC) review conducted in February and March to determine if the SARC has been posted on the CDE website (due Feb. 1) and if the data reported in the SARC is accurate and related to instructional materials, facilities maintenance, and teacher credentialing. The SARC was found to be correctly posted on the CDE website for all four school sites.
Extended Learning Opportunity Program Update	Emma Pereida-Martinez gave an overview of the ELOP requirements. "Expanded learning" means after school, summer, or intersession learning programs that focus on developing the academic, social, emotional, and physical needs and interests of pupils through hands-on, engaging learning experiences. She shared that AUSD will provide the first 10 days out of 30 of ELOP opportunities this July 5 th through July 18 th up to 9 hours a day. Additionally, for every day the school is in session and open we must be open for a total of nine hours. The district has posted for a Supervisor II of Expanded Learning Opportunities Program. This person will be similar to a principal and will oversee all afterschool programs.
Noon Duty Personnel & Other Possible Positions	Emma Pereida-Martinez shared the district is currently seeking noon duty aides and possibly other positions. If you are interested or know of someone that is interested, please direct them to the district

office to complete a job application. She also shared the students will return to eating in the cafeteria for Summer School and for the 2022-2023 school year.

Universal Prekindergarten Update

A Parent Square message is scheduled to go out regarding information pertaining to the new Universal Prekindergarten Program. Mrs. Pereida-Martinez reports the new law AB130 established that all 4-year-olds whose birthdates fall between February 2nd – April 2nd) be eligible for TK regardless of social economic status. This enrichment program/center will be located at Bear Mountain Elementary School and will be expanding on that site. Registration is available at all elementary school site main offices where they are currently taking applications. Angelica Salinas, Superviosr II, Early Childhood Education will be is looking forward to the implementation of the new Discovery Enrichment Center. She shared her contact information via chat if anyone has a question regarding the new program. Angelica confirmed the message was sent out via Parent Square.

Alternate Income Application

Susie Reyes reported on the Assembly Bill AB 130 which established the California Universal Meal Program. Under this program beginning 2022-2023 school year all schools will be required to provide two free meals to all students requesting meals. However, parents are still required to submit an Alternate Income Application for any new incoming student. The application is needed annually for purposes of LCFF.

End of the Year Recognition

Mrs. Pereida-Martinez thanked all school site representatives/president and vice president for their hard work and dedication to the AUSD District Advisory Committee. Members received a goody bag as a token of appreciation.
