Enrollment Timeline

Honors English 2 Summer Reading Assignment

If your child signs up for Honors English 2, he or she will need to complete a summer reading assignment, which is due during the first week of school. Teachers will talk to the students and hand out books before the end of the school year. If your child is moving from English 1 to Honors English 2, it is important that he or she check with their current English teacher to obtain the assignment.



Accelerated US History 10

Students that want to take AP US History their junior year need to take Accelerated US History 10 their sophomore year. This class is a semester long and is usually taken the semester opposite of the semester they take Modern World History. This class also serves as the social studies elective needed to meet the student's graduation requirements.



Andover Central High School Graduation Requirements

To meet the Andover Central High School graduation requirements, students need to complete the following credits during their four years at ACHS.

English - 4 credits
Math - 3 credits
Science - 3 credits
Social Studies - 3 credits
Fine Arts - 1 credit
Health - 0.5 credit
P.E.- 0.5 credit

Computer Science - 0.5 credit

Speech - 0.5 credit

Elective Classes - 9 credits

Total Required: 25 credits

Students who have excelled academically during their time in high school are recognized based on the Latin Honors System. The Latin honors, Summa Cum Laude, Magna Cum Laude, and Cum Laude, are assigned according to students' weighted GPA and will be distinguished at commencement by different color cords which will be worn with other regalia. Because we have moved to this system of recognition, which relies on weighted GPA's, we do not rank students and we do not recognize a Valedictorian or Salutatorian.
