## Enrollment Timeline

Jan 27th- Students work on their Individual Plan of Study (IPS) in Xello during Seminar.

Feb 8th - Presentations during seminar provide students with the information needed to complete enrollment for next year's classes on line. (The presentation slide show will be made available in the Counselor's Google Classroom for Class of 2025.)

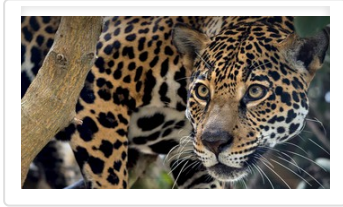
**Feb 8th - Parent/Teacher Conferences and Enrollment Fair, 7:00 p.m. - 8:00 p.m.**

Online Enrollment is February 8th - 24th. Log into your PowerSchool page and click on Class Registration to pick courses!



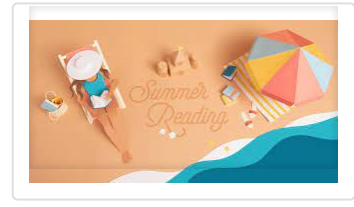
## Senior Required Classes

- English 4, AP Literature, or English Composition 1 and 2
- US Government or AP Government or BCC US Government
- Others that students might need to finish up in senior year: fine arts, speech, social studies elective and maybe computers.



## AP Classes

These are courses based on rigorous curriculum designed by educators from secondary schools and higher education. Juniors can take a variety of AP courses. Students take the class, and in the spring they take the AP tests, which (this year) cost \$97 each. Based on the scores a student earns, colleges and universities give various levels of college credit.



## AP Lit Summer Reading

Students who plan to take AP Literature their Senior year, will have a summer reading assignment that will consist of one to two novels and accompanying analysis questions. The AP teachers will visit with juniors signed up to take AP Lit about the summer assignment prior to the end of this school year.

## Class of 2024 Off Hours Policy & Procedure

- All seniors may enroll for up to 2 Off Hours for the Spring Semester (only) of their senior year.
- To be eligible, students must be on track to graduate and not be working on credit recovery during the spring semester.
- Off hours may only be scheduled at the beginning or the end of the day.

## Butler Dual Credit

Courses are taught either here at ACHS or on Butler's campus. Most students wait until senior year to take dual or concurrent college courses because they align with some of our high school senior graduation requirements. Some students who want to attend the Butler Academies, Andover CAPS and WSU Tech, begin their junior year.

**Concurrent Credit:** These meet at ACHS and the instructor is usually an ACHS staff member. We offer English Comp 1 and 2 (senior English), Speech, College Algebra, Applied Statistics, and Government. If we offer a concurrent class in our building, students have to take it rather than a dual credit offering of the same course. (Exceptions are made for Butler Academy, WSU Tech, and CAPS students.)

**Dual Credit:** These meet on Butler's campus. Students are welcome to take classes that we do not offer here in our building.

To qualify to enroll in Butler classes, students need to have earned an 18 on the English section of the ACT and/or 21 on Math section of the ACT.

If a student has not earned those scores or has not taken the ACT, they may qualify by earning a passing score on the Accuplacer Test that Butler offers.

Once a student has signed up to take a Butler class, they must go on-line and create an application account with Butler and complete the admissions application.

## Graduation Information

To meet the Andover Central High School graduation requirements, students need to complete the following credits during their four years at ACHS.

English- 4 credits

Math- 3 credits

Science- 3 credits

Social Studies- 3 credits

Fine Arts- 1 credit

Health- 0.5 credit

P.E.- 0.5 credit

Computer Science- 0.5 credit

Speech- 0.5 credit

Elective Classes- 9 credits

Total Required: 25 credits

Students who have excelled academically during their time in high school are recognized based on the Latin Honors System. The Latin honors, Summa Cum Laude, Magna Cum Laude, and Cum Laude, are assigned according to students' weighted GPA and will be distinguished at commencement by different color cords which will be worn with other regalia. Because we have moved to this system of recognition, which relies on weighted GPA's, we do not rank students and we do not recognize a Valedictorian or Salutatorian.
