A Holy Lent

e begin the season of Lent this week. There are many opportunities to live into this special time of reflection and preparation. Prayer offerings, daily Mass, adoration and

confession, and community-building evenings are open to all. Pick up the Lent at OLGC brochure and Little Black Book in the Narthex to discover how to have a holy Lent.

The acts of abstinence, fasting, prayer, and almsgiving is in a spirit of penance and of preparation for the renewal of our baptismal promises at the Easter Vigil and/or Easter Morning Masses.


Abstinence and Fasting

Ash Wednesday, February 22, and Good Friday, April 7 are days of fasting and abstinence. Fridays of

Lent are also days of abstinence. Fasting is to be observed by all 18 years of age and older, up to the beginning of their 60th year. On a fast day, one full meal is allowed. Two other meals, sufficient to maintain strength, may be taken according to each one's needs, but together they should not equal another full meal. Eating between meals is not permitted, but liquids, including milk and juices, are allowed. Abstinence is observed by all 14 years of age and older. On days of abstinence, no meat is allowed.

Almsgiving

Almsgiving is our response to the teachings of Jesus that encourages us to reach out to people in need—not just with our money—but with our time and talent. It is the act of donating money, food, or other items to the poor or needy. Almsgiving helps us experience giving the gifts of God that He gave to us by sharing with others. Today, we might also refer to this as stewardship.

Why Ashes?

For centuries Catholic Christians have marked the beginning of the season of Lent by receiving ash on their foreheads on Ash Wednesday. This tradition has its roots in the Old Testament, where wearing ashes was a common sign of repentance for sins, and a sign of one's humility before God. Since Lent is a season of penitential renewal through prayer, fasting, and almsgiving, it's appropriate that this ancient sign marks the beginning of the season.

Ashes are usually distributed as part of a Mass or Liturgy of the Word on Ash Wednesday, often after the homily. As people approach the minister, ash is pressed on your forehead, and he speaks: "Remember that you are dust, and to dust you shall return,"

or "Repent and believe in the Gospel."

In many churches, Ash Wednesday services are among the most popular of the whole year. Cynics have suggested that this is because people "get" something, as they do on Palm Sunday. But there's nothing particularly appealing about being smudged with ashes. Perhaps, the appeal is the expression through a physical sign of a desire for interior conversion.

The Gospel for Ash Wednesday is a reminder that the real purpose of the season of Lent isn't to make public demonstrations of piety—even the wearing of ashes—but to seek conversion of heart. (Notes from usccb.org)





NORMAS PARA EL AYUNO Y LA ABSTINENCIA

El miércoles de ceniza, 22 de febrero, y el viernes santo, 7 de abril, son días de abstinencia y de avuno. Asimismo, los viernes durante la Cuaresma son días de abstinencia, los viernes durante la Cuaresma todas las personas a partir de los 18 años y los que no hayan cumplido los 59 años, deben ayunar. Se permite comer una vez durante el día de ayuno, aunque también pueden comer dos veces para mantener la energía, según la necesidad de cada individuo. Sin embargo, estas dos comidas no deben igualar a la cantidad de una comida completa. No se puede comer entre comidas, pero está permitido tomar líquido, incluyendo leche y jugos. La abstinencia se debe cumplir desde los 14 años en adelante. En los días de abstinencia, no se debe comer carne, aunque si la salud o la habilidad para cumplir su trabajo se ve seriamente afectado, la ley no lo obliga. Si tiene alguna duda sobre la práctica del avuno o de la abstinencia, consulte al Sacerdote de su parroquia. El ayuno, la

limosna y la oración, son las tres disciplinas tradicionales durante la Cuaresma. Los feligreses y los catecúmenos deben realizar estas prácticas con seriedad en espíritu de penitencia y en preparación para la Iniciación a la Iglesia o para la renovación de las promesas Bautismales durante la Semana Santa.


Elder Wisdom


