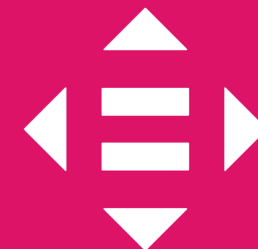

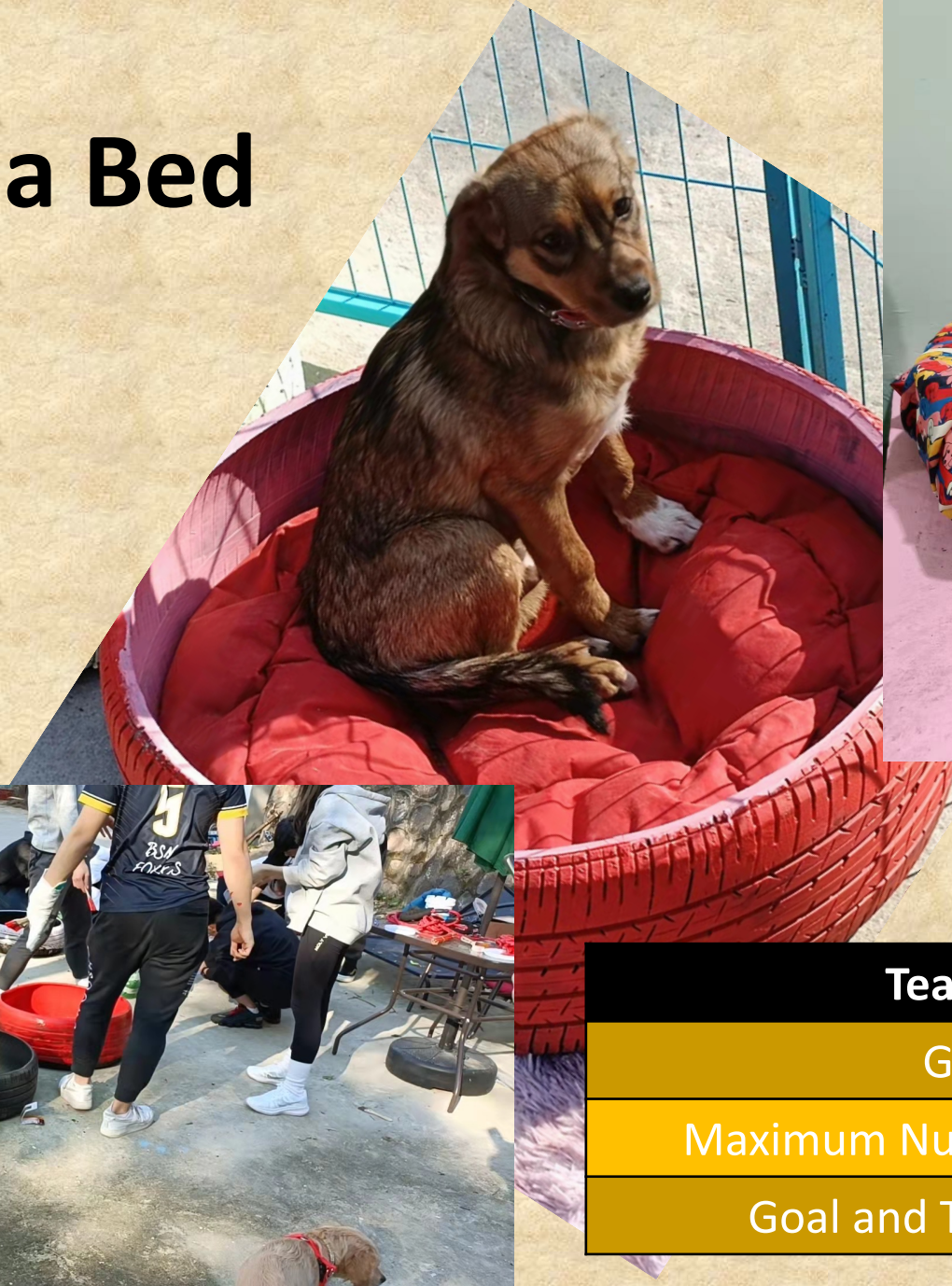

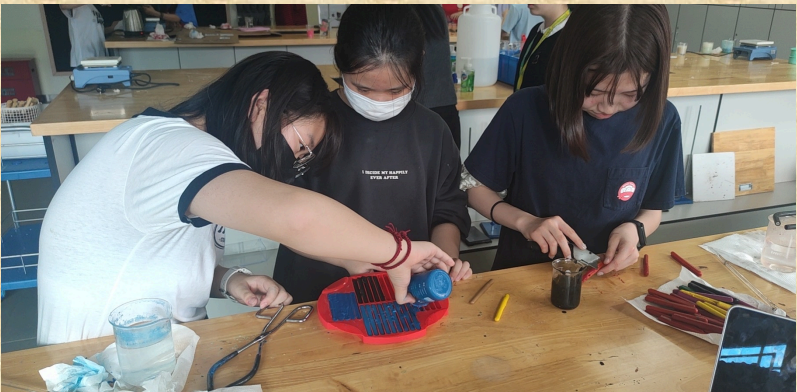
#17 - Social Enterprise

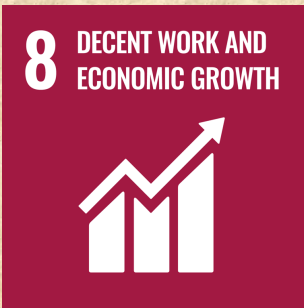
