## Career and Technology Education Month






CTE, learners acquire specific skills to pursue their career passion while also building a foundation for lifelong learning.

## Are You Interested In Being a CNA Fall 2024?

SHS partners with MATC to offer a CNA class. If you have any interest in taking the CNA course in the Fall semester of the 23-24 school year based on the description below please fill out the application linked **below** and return it to Ms. Schoemer (via email or physical copy) by **Wednesday, March 1st**. Completing the application does not mean you are locked into taking the course, however, students cannot take the course without it. Again, if you



are at all interested please complete the application. If you have any questions please feel free to email <u>Ms. Schoemer</u> or <u>Mr. Stokes</u>.

The Nursing Assistant class is a great jump start to a career in health sciences and is a prerequisite for acceptance into most college level health science programs This hybrid course is taught by MATC staff and combines online instruction, on-site lab instruction, and community- based clinical experience. Students who complete the course successfully earn 3 college credits from MATC and are eligible to take the state certification exam (written and skill) and be listed on the Wisconsin Nurse Aide Registry.

CNA Course Application

Start College Now/Early College Credit Program - Fall 2023 If you are an upperclassman who has exhausted courses in an area of interest and are looking for more opportunities, consider taking college courses through the Start College Now (through MATC) or Early College Credit Program (through a four year school). This program allows students to explore additional educational opportunities that the school district would pay for while earning college credit. Simply completing the application does not guarantee that a course will be available or work within the school credit requirements but does open the door to the possibility. For the Fall of 2023, we need your applications by **Wednesday, March 1st** in order to be considered. Late



To pay previous year fees, please change the year and then add those items to your cart.








## SHS Prom 2023





## Spring Athletics Registration Instructions

- 1. Login to the Infinite Campus Parent Portal.
- 2. Select "School Store" on the left hand side.
- 3. Select "Stoughton High School"
- 4. Select "Athletics."
- 5. Select the sport for which you are registering.
- 6. Under recipient, select the student who is registering for the sport from the drop down menu.
- 7. Scroll down to the list of Required Forms. Click on each form and enter the information needed in each fillable field.
- 8. At the very bottom of each form, there will be a spot to sign. Click on the red icon to complete your signature and then click on "Submit."
- 9. After all forms have been completed, add the sport to your cart.
- 10. Click on "My Cart," and checkout for \$0.00 by clicking "Submit." (There is no fee to complete the registration. Sport fees will be added to Infinite Campus after all sport seasons have begun and rosters have been formed.)
- 11. Your student will need to login to the <u>Infinite Campus Student Portal</u> to sign the forms as well they will appear on their home screen under "Documents."
