Graduation Requirements

Core Course Requirements

- 4 Units of English
 - (must include 9 Lit and Am Lit)
- 4 Units of Math
 - (must include algebra, geometry, and algebra 2)
- 4 Units of Science
 - (must include Bio, physical or physics, and earth, environmental, or chem)
- 3 Units of Social Studies
 - (must include world history, US History, and govt/econ)

Elective Requirements

- 1 Unit of Health (.5) and Personal Fitness (.5) or 3 years of JROTC
- 3 Units of required electives
 - (World Language, Fine Arts and/or Career/Technical)
- 4 Units of miscellaneous electives
- TAA provides potential .5 credit Pass or Fail grade

- Students that wish to take college level coursework for credit towards both high school and college graduation requirements.
- Students must begin process with college first.
- Deadlines at some colleges are very early.

Dual Enrollment

Pros

- The potential for earning college credit is available especially for students that are planning to attend a school within the University system of Georgia
- May reduce cost of college
- Doesn't tap into HOPE

Cons

- Miss out on Etowah High School atmosphere and experiences
- Not all college credit via Dual is accepted at all colleges
- AP courses and tests may be used for college credit
- Part Time students may have conflicts with their EHS schedule.



Promotion to 12th Grade

To be placed in a Senior homeroom next fall, students must have earned 17 total units of credit that must include:

3 units of English

3 units of Math

2 units of Science

1 unit of Social Studies

*Students must be in a senior homeroom to be eligible for a parking pass and correct picture placement in the yearbook.



Promotion to 11th Grade

To be placed in a Junior homeroom next fall, students must have earned 11 total units of credit that must include:

2 units of English2 units of Math1 unit of Science

*Students must be on track in a Junior homeroom to be eligible for a parking pass.

20 Hours of Documented Global Community Service

Examples:

- Raising Money for Hands and Feet Ministries
- Providing activities for children of Spanish speaking parents that come to school for informational evening seminars
- Providing translation services in school-based events
- Any approved school-based cross cultural /global community service activity
- Faith-based mission trips
- Volunteering in Citizenship classes
- Volunteering in English classes
- Shoeboxes for Christmas



Capstone Project

- The Senior Project must include an international focus and demonstrate connections between the international course work, the extracurricular activities, the service project, and product developed during the senior project.
- Product Log will include additional work composed of documentation of Global Community Service and Extracurricular Activities along with a written reflection.



Fine Arts Skills Diploma

- "The Fine Arts Diploma Seal is awarded to graduating high school students who complete a Georgia Fine Arts Pathway and engage in creative industry focus courses, extra-curricular activities, and experiences that foster fine arts mastery."
- "It is a signal to employers and higher education institutions that a student is prepared to participate in the creative economy."

Preliminary Selection

- You must have completed a Fine Arts Pathway and one more Fine Arts elective or CTAE elective.
- Dr. Schmid will check your transcript. Just apply.

2 Fine Arts Related Extracurricular Activities or Experiences:

Activities that are fine arts related could be -

Examples:

20 Hours of Documented Arts Related Community Service

GHP Opportunity

- http://gosa.georgia.gov/governors-honors-program
- GHP is a four-week, summer residential program designed to provide intellectually gifted and artistically talented high school students challenging and enriching educational opportunities.
- Only 1% of sophomores and juniors in the state of Georgia are nominated to the state level for the Program.
- The Georgia Governor's Honors Program is fully funded by the Georgia General Assembly and operates at no cost to participants.
- Students are nominated by teachers and information has not been posted yet for this year's organizational timeline.
- Nominations by teachers are typically due in October.

PSAT

Wednesday, October 13th during the school day

- All 9th and 10th grade students
- 11th Grade students may opt to take the PSAT for a fee. Students will receive information regarding registration for the PSAT during TAA and it will also be posted to the EHS web site.
- Tests Critical Reading, Math, and Writing Skills
- Prepares students to take the SAT, shows AP Potential

*In 11th grade, PSAT scores are used to qualify students for the National Merit Scholarship

ACT/SAT

SAT/ACT can be taken multiple times

- Usually required to apply to colleges and universities (not required for technical colleges)
- College-bound Seniors should try to take fall semester, if possible, to meet application deadlines
- SAT vs. ACT: both are recognized at MOST colleges and universities

HOPE and Zell Miller Scholarship

SSN Verification:

 Social Security numbers are required to be in ASPEN for a student to be HOPE eligible.

Rigor Requirement

4 courses complete prior to graduation (examples: Algebra 2 or higher, Chemistry, Physics, 2nd year of Foreign Language or higher, AP Courses)

> HOPE Scholarship:

- 3.0 academic GPA, covers approximately 90% of the previous year's tuition
- > Zell Miller scholarship:
 - 3.7 academic GPA—covers 100% of tuition
 - SAT 1200 combined CR and Math or 26 ACT composite
