<p>COGAT Testing</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> In grade 2, we ranked 6th overall of all elementary schools in the district for composite score. In grade 4, we ranked 4th overall of all elementary schools in the district for composite score. This score, while being an abilities test, helps us better understand our students and help forecast where our other scores should land.
<p>CCRPI</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> The state is only giving Content Mastery scores due to circumstances related to COVID. 2018: 84 Content Mastery 2019: 86.8 Content Mastery 2022: 89.6 Content Mastery- continuing to make forward progress through the pandemic We are 1 of 4 schools that continue to make forward progress throughout the pandemic. We will reinstate our Star Writing Club (previously called EXP) with students in the Spring as we prepare for Milestones. Our Science scores have had huge gains over the past 3 school years: from 69.50 in 2018 to 83.96 in 2022.
<p>iReady, easyCBM, NSGRA</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> iReady <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Results pending (513/713 students tested). Preliminary glance shows increase in Tier 1 (green) and decrease in Tier 2 (yellow). Highlight given to K and 1st- both have shown huge gains in Tier 1 (green). K grew Tier 1 from 23% in the fall to 67% in the winter. 1st grew Tier 1 from 15% in the fall to 52% in the winter. Overall, all grade levels showing fabulous growth from fall to winter iReady benchmarks. EasyCBM <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Growth seen in all grades on given benchmarks.
