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What is Dual Enrollment (DE)?

- Students take college classes while still enrolled in high school
- Students earn credit for both high school and college at the same time
- Full time and part time options available
- Available at Georgia public, private and technical colleges/universities
- State funding provided for tuition, fees and books
- Courses online or on campus

Admission Requirements

- Minimum General Qualifications
 - Eligibility based on grade level
 - CCSD Dual Enrollment Participation Form
 - Counselor meeting with student and family
- Institution Qualifications
- Institution Application
- Additional Qualification Tests (per subject)
- Pre-requisite Courses
- Final Grades



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Who Can Participate in DE?

- 11th and 12th grade students are eligible to participate
- 10th grade students are eligible to participate IF they have:
 - a minimum SAT score of 1200*, or
 - a minimum ACT composite score of 26*
- 10th grade students can take approved CTAE courses
- 9th grade students are not eligible to participate

*in a single administration

Course Limitations

- Students are limited to a total of 30 semester hours, or 45 quarter hours, funded by the DE program
- Core academic areas (English, math, science, social studies and world languages) are approved for DE funding
- Career, Technical and Agricultural Education (CTAE) courses are approved for DE funding
- Fine Arts, PE and Health courses are not eligible for DE funding
- Students do not receive program funding to retake/repeat a course
- Students become ineligible for future DE funding after withdrawing from DE courses two times

Self-Pay Option

- Students who exhaust their 30 semester hours of DE funding can utilize a self-pay tuition option to take additional DE coursework
- Students must use all available DE funding before utilizing self-pay
- Only courses approved for DE funding will be permitted for self-pay
- Self-paid DE courses will appear on a student's high school transcript
- For a semester in which funding is mixed between DE and self-pay, students are eligible to have mandatory fees waived and are provided required books
- For a semester in which all DE courses are self-paid, students are responsible for all tuition, fees, and textbooks

Grading

Many institutions use letter grading systems. When a numerical grade is unavailable, the correlation of students' grades earned at the post-secondary institution and the secondary grade shall be as follows:

<u>Post-secondary Grade</u>	<u>CCSD High School Grade</u>
A	95
B	85
C	75
D	70
F	60

DE Grade Weighting

- Students will receive grade weighting on their CCSD High School Transcript for DE courses that are equivalent to an AP course
- The grade weighting will be the same as CCSD AP courses:
 - 1.0 on the GPA
 - 10 points on the NGA
- DE course equivalency to AP courses is determined by each individual institution; see specific institutional websites for details
- Students can only earn AP weighting for the same AP course once
 - Example: Student took AP Biology through CCSD and earned AP weighting. Later, the student took a DE Biology that is considered AP equivalent but would *not* receive AP weighting because it had been earned previously.

Full-Time DE vs. Part-Time DE

Full-Time Status:

- *4 or more DE courses totaling at least 12 credit hours at the DE institution (up to a maximum of 15 total hours)*

--- or ---

Part-Time Status:

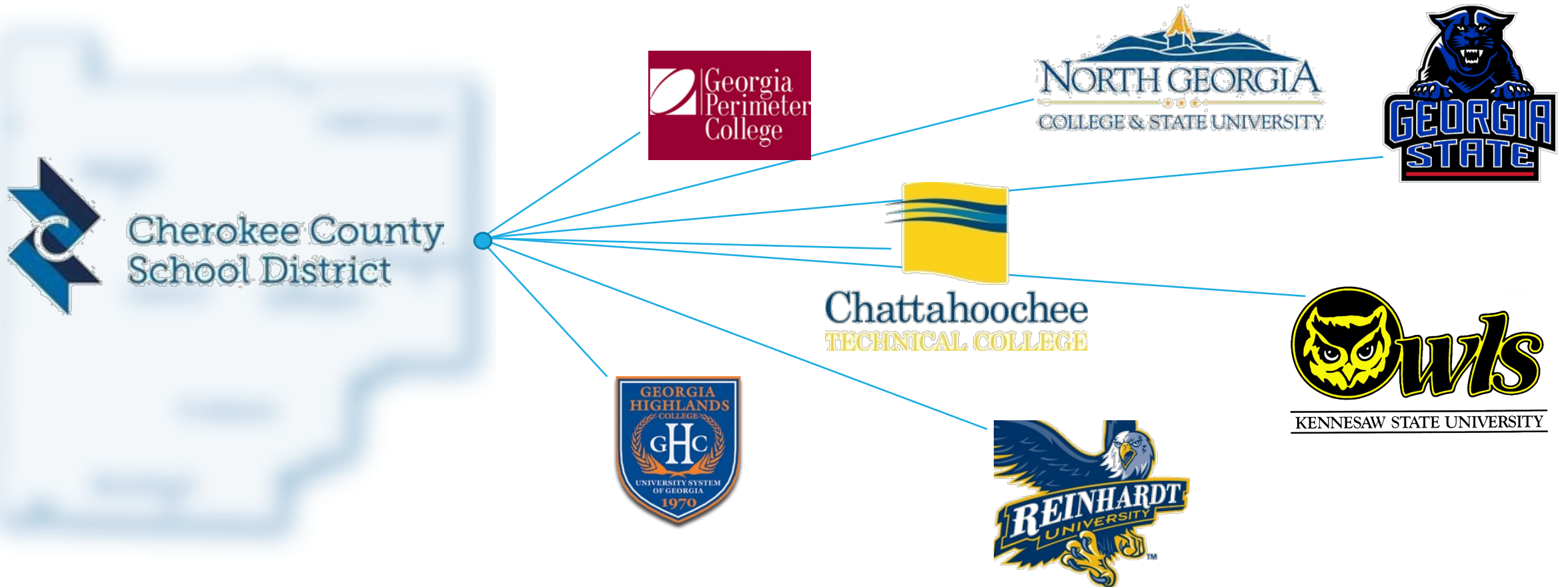
- *Any combination totaling six classes. For example:*
 - *1 DE course plus 5 courses at the home high school*
 - *2 DE course plus 4 courses at the home high school*
 - *3 DE course plus 3 courses at the home high school*

Keep in mind travel time if participating as a part-time DE student

Joint Enrollment

- Joint Enrollment (JE) is the term used for college courses taken by a student that are not approved under DE
- These include Fine Arts, PE and Health courses
- Joint Enrollment courses are not eligible for DE funding
- Joint Enrollment courses does not go on a student's CCSD High School Transcript
- Joint Enrollment courses do not count toward a student's full-time enrollment and do not appear on the student's high school schedule
- Joint Enrollment courses do not have any link to CCSD scheduling, transcripts, or coursework
