Application Cover Sheet

Your essay should answer all six (6) questions. Each question should have its own paragraph, separated by an extra line.

- 1. Tell us about yourself, such as your interests, hobbies, etc.
- 2. Why did you choose to pursue a career in your program area?
- 3. After graduation from MNTC, what are your career plans including short- and long-term goals?
- 4. What tools, supplies, and/or equipment would benefit you most in your new career?
- 5. How would receiving this scholarship make a difference in your career success?
- 6. Give an example of an accomplishment of which you are most proud.

Interview Prep:

- 1. Appearance, composure, and nonverbal communication
 - a. Handshake / Greeting / Closing
 - b. Grooming / Neatness
 - c. Attire
 - d. Eye Contact / Posture

2. Preparation

- a. Students should prepare one to two questions to ask during the interview. An example might be, "When will I know if I have been chosen to receive a scholarship?"
- b. The questions should be related to the scholarship and/or interview process. An example might be, "How might I improve my interview skills?"
- 3. Verbal Communication
 - a. Delivery / Animation
 - b. Absence of Verbalized Pauses
 - c. Grammar and Vocabulary
 - d. Presentation of Ideas
 - e. Conciseness / Brevity
- 4. Direction
 - a. Well-Defined Goals
 - b. Confidence
 - c. Realistic / Practical
- 5. Personality
 - a. Enthusiastic
 - b. Motivated
 - c. Sincere
- 6. Qualifications
 - a. Academic Preparation
 - b. Work Experience
 - c. Leadership Experience
