Robotics team sweeps state meet

The CISD Board recognized the CHS Tigers in Motion Robotics Team for its top performance at the state level. The team swept the 1A - 3A event winning the tournament championship trophy, the runner up trophy, the individual robotics skills championship and the individual robotics skills runner up.

Sponsor and CHS teacher Earvin Larry proudly noted that his team competed in 10 tournaments this year and won four consecutive tournaments defeating 4A and 5A programs such as Lovejoy, Highland Park, Thomas Jefferson and Skyline High Schools.

Larry's teams qualified for the state competition in 2018 and qualified for the state and world competitions in 2020. In 2021, the Tigers in Motion won the state championship. The team was the state runner up in 2022 and was also a nationals qualifier and drone champion. Congratulations!

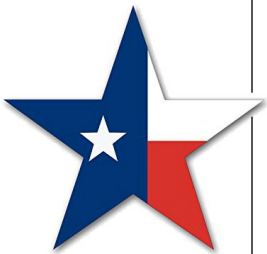
