Elementary and High School Principal Reports were presented.
Supt. Fodness reported on the upcoming food service review (February
2023) and that the weekly construction meetings will now be held bi-weekly.

Discussion was held on the Safe Return to In Person Instruction & Continuity of Service Plan (no changes to the plan recommended).
66-23-Motion by Longbrake, second by McDaniel to approve the Safe Return to In Person Instruction & Continuity of Service Plan with no changes.
67-23-Motion by Smith, second by Longbrake to set the School Board Election date in conjunction with the City Election to be held on Tuesday, April 11, 2023.
68-23-Motion by Longbrake, second by McDaniel to establish polling precincts in the following communities: Dupree, Bridger, Thunder Butte, Red Scaffold and Cherry Creek.

Board Member, Mandi Smith was appointed LAN Board Representative.

Discussion was held on Social Studies Content Standards.

69-23-Motion by McDaniel, second by Longbrake to approve the following Resolution: South Dakota teachers, administrators, and school board members from around the state made clear in public comment and testimony during the State Board of Education Standard hearings their serious concerns with the proposed Social Studies standards from the Social Studies Content Standards Commission. We, the Dupree School Board, oppose the proposed Social Studies standards for the following reasons.

Whereas:

1. The process of revising the Social Studies standards was done in a manner that did not consult the expertise of South Dakota educators in their development, as has been the practice for decades of standards revision;
2. The proposed Social Studies standards are not based on educational best practices, but rather are written tasks, not standards;
3. Many of the proposed Social Studies standards are not age appropriate for students, lack depth of knowledge, higher order thinking, and do not address skill development;
4. The proposed standards would require excessive contact hours to teach to students, which would take time away from other curricular subjects;
5. Current Social Studies materials used in school do not align with the proposed Social Studies standards, which will result in new materials, teacher training, and resources needing to be purchased at a high cost to schools.

Therefore we, the Dupree School Board respectfully ask the State Board of Education Standards request the Department of Education reconvene the Social Studies workgroup from 2021, with instructions for the workgroup to revise their draft with consideration of the Social Studies Content Standards Commission's proposal. The goal should be a third proposed set of standards as a compromise between the first two Social Studies contents standards proposals.
