

### **New Britain COVID-19 Report**

#### New Britain Positive COVID-19 in the Past 7 Days



As of February 23<sup>rd</sup>, 2023, in New Britain, for the past 7 days, there were 28 positive NAAT tests, and the percent positivity (NAAT) is 5.87%. In New Britain, in the last 7 days, there were 5 positive antigen tests.

Number of cases for the past 7 days 17. New Britain's case rate is 3.3 per 100,000 residents.

COVID-19 Community Transmission in New Britain is Moderate.

New cases per 100,000 persons in the past 7 days: 3.3 (Low)


Percentage of positive NAATs tests during the past 7 days: 5.87% (Moderate)

As of February 23<sup>rd</sup>, 2023, 12.40% of New Britain residents have received a COVID-19 bivalent booster.

The age group with the highest percent of individuals with a bivalent dose is 65 and older (39.5%), followed by 45-64 (18.1%), 25-44 (8.5%), 15-24 (4.1%), and 5-14 (3.0%).




During the week of 02/10/23 – 02/16/23, The Hospital of Central Connecticut (THOCC) in New Britain had a total of 101 adult COVID-19 patients hospitalized, and 11 COVID-19 patients in the ICU.

The Hospital for Special Care had 5 COVID-19 adult patients hospitalized, and zero in the ICU.

No pediatric patients hospitalized with COVID-19 in both hospitals.

As of February 23<sup>rd</sup>, 2023, New Britain School District reported 1052 possible and confirmed COVID-19 cases since August 27<sup>th</sup>, 2022. Among them, 337 (32.03%) are staff members and 715 (67.97%) are students.



# Hartford County Positive COVID-19 in the Past 7 Days



As of February 23<sup>rd</sup>, 2023, in Hartford County, there were 246 positive PCR/NAAT tests and 142 positive antigen tests in the past 7 days. The percent positivity of PCR/NAAT tests in Hartford County is 4.57%.

According to Connecticut Department of Public Health (CT DPH), As of February 23<sup>rd</sup>, 2023, the total of laboratory-confirmed and probable COVID-19 cases reported among Connecticut residents is 974,143; 1,127 have been reported in the past 7 days. Two hundred ninety-four patients are currently hospitalized with laboratory-confirmed COVID-19; of these, 90 (30.61%) are not fully vaccinated. The percent positivity in Connecticut is 5.86%.



As of February 23<sup>rd</sup>, 2023, CT Community Level of Hartford County is Medium.

#### 7) Test to Treat Locations

DPH has partnered with four federal qualified health centers that offer no-cost COVID-19 testing and treatment including:

- Charter Oak Health Center Inc, 21 Grand St, Hartford
- Fair Haven Community Health Clinic, 374 Grand Ave, New Haven
- Family Centers Health Care, 111 Wilbur Peck Court, Greenwich
- Southwest Community Health Center, 1020 Fairfield Ave, Bridgeport

In addition to the FQHCs, the nationwide <u>Test to Treat</u> initiative provides testing for COVID-19 and treatments from a health care provider, all in one location. Connecticut currently has more than 40 Test to Treat sites, which are located at select pharmacies and urgent care centers throughout the state.
