Facilities Reservations: All requests for facility use within the White Bear Lake Area School District #624 should be made on either the Facility Scheduling Voicemail Line, 651-407-7503, or email your request to: facilities@isd624.org.

Refunds & Prorating: Notify Community Services & Recreation immediately if you need to withdraw from a class. Full refunds or credits are given if a class is canceled. Refunds are not issued after a class has begun. There are no prorated fees. To receive a refund, minus a processing fee, you must withdraw from an activity at least 3 business days prior to the first day of the activity.

Processing fees for classes:

- Under \$50 have a \$5 fee
- \$50-\$149 have a \$10 fee
- \$150-\$399 have a \$20 fee
- \$400+ have a \$30 fee

UCare Discount: UCare members may be eligible for a \$15 discount on most classes. If a class is less than \$15, the class will be free of charge. Members must have UCare ID number at the time of registration and during the class(es). This discount cannot be used for the following: private lessons, alcohol-related activities, high-risk activities (skydiving, rock climbing, etc.), and gambling trips. **To have your discount applied, you must call 651-407-7501 to register.**

Your Privacy is Important to Us: Your registration information is considered private data under state and federal law. Information is used for the purposes of administering the activity, contacting you about upcoming activities, events or activity changes. If you choose to withhold this information, this could limit the distribution of information to the participant or instructor.

Recommendation: Mariner Middle School

Rationale:

- Mariner was original name of the building (72-83).
- Number of suggestions demonstrates strong community support for Mariner.

Mariner Middle School approved

The School Board recently approved a recommendation to change the name of Sunrise Park Middle School when it moves from the Sunrise Park neighborhood to the current WBLAHS - South Campus building in the fall of 2024. The new name, Mariner Middle School, is a nod to the District's past.

"As a proud graduate of Mariner High School and a student of Sunrise Park Junior High School, I appreciate the work of the committee in honoring our school district's history in this way," said School Board member Scott Arcand. "The strong community support that emerged for 'Mariner' during the name submission process makes it evident that this name is meaningful for our Mariner graduates."

The renaming of the middle school comes after a process that took place during the 2022-23 academic year. A naming committee composed of students and parents, community members, staff, and administration, solicited input from the community. More than 300 recommendations were submitted, half of them including "Mariner" and about 40 including "Sunrise." Using the feedback, the committee came to consensus on two names and submitted both Sunrise and Mariner, along with the rationale for each, to the Superintendent to review with district administration.

The final recommendation of Mariner Middle School was chosen in recognition of the original name of the building when it opened as White Bear Mariner Senior High School in the fall of 1972. In 1983, the district's two high schools, White Bear High School and White Bear Mariner High School, merged to become White Bear Lake Area High School with the two buildings identified as the North and South Campuses.

"The name selection honors the history of the school district by returning the original name, Mariner, to the building," said principal Christina Pierre, who co-chaired the committee along with Tim Wald, Assistant Superintendent for Finance and Operations. "Mariner High School was recognized for innovation and excellence. This sets a high standard for the middle school as we move into the newly renovated space."

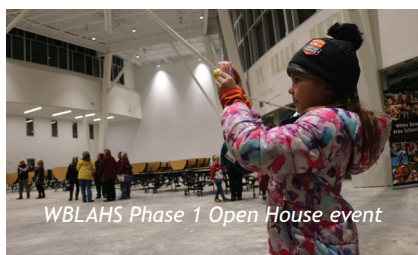
When the middle school program moves to the current South Campus building in the fall of 2024, the Sunrise building will undergo renovations and become the site of District Center, Early Childhood, Transition Education Center (TEC) and the Senior Center.

Building Construction Updates

Since 2019, when the community supported a bond referendum to fund building projects throughout White Bear Lake Area Schools, the changes to the district's landscape are hard to miss.

The unified high school project has seen the most striking changes, and lots of foot traffic, in recent weeks. More than 600 students, families, graduates and community members joined us for our Circle Back to North Campus special event in January. Attendees were able to learn WBLAHS history through information boards created by members of the school's History Club with help from the White Bear Lake Area Historical Society, see renderings of the new space, share their North Campus memories, and walk the circles one last time before renovations to the original parts of the building began.

Another special event provided the opportunity to check out the new addition the following week. Approximately 850 visitors attended a Phase 1 Open House that took place just before ninth and tenth graders moved into the newly-constructed three-story building to begin their second semester. When finished in the fall of 2024, the unified high school will serve students in grades 9-12.

Other projects still in process include Oneka Elementary, which is currently under construction, and Central Middle School, which is in the design phase. The future conversion of Sunrise Park Middle School to become a multi-use facility that houses District Offices, Early Childhood, Transition Education Center (TEC) and the Senior Program is also on the horizon.

District-wide, the list of facilities projects that have been completed now includes the Transportation Facility, Area Learning Center (ALC), and elementary additions at Birch Lake, Lakeaires, Lincoln, Matoska, Otter Lake, Vadnais Heights and Willow Lane. Gymnasium, classroom and office spaces were added at WBLAHS - South Campus as part of the plan to transition the building into Mariner Middle School when North Campus becomes the site of the unified high school in the fall of 2024. In Hugo, the new North Star Elementary opened for students this fall.

All projects approved in the Building Our Future Bond Referendum are scheduled to be completed through the 2024-25 academic year.

Another form of informal partnership that has been built around a lunchtime schedule is a tradition that began before my days as superintendent. Periodically throughout the school year, we pull together groups of middle school and high school students who serve as members in the superintendent's student advisory groups.

Discussions that have happened around a shared meal have included sneak peeks at the construction projects happening throughout the district and important conversations about district initiatives. Another fun activity on these meeting agendas, and a student favorite, are taste testing activities facilitated by our Nutrition Services Department. Not only have students given opinions about the appropriate level of spice in a dish and talked about diversifying meal options, they have also given input on the overall elements of the student experience in the lunchroom.

While we hope these conversations have been informative for students, who get to hear directly from district leaders about programs happening throughout White Bear, they've been equally informative for the adults in the room. Whether we're learning first-hand about the issues most important to students or collecting their input to design a better cafeteria experience, the lessons learned over lunch are lasting and have made a difference in how we "do school" for current students and for those who will come after them.

Another collaboration during the lunch hour was our recent February Coffee with Dr. K event. These informal conversations, which are attendee-driven so the discussions are varied and tailored to those in the room, have been a fun way to get to know what's on the mind of our community members.

Since we began hosting the chats during my first year as superintendent in 2017, those filling the room have played the role of parents, grandparents, former staff members and curious community members - and some attendees have filled the shoes of multiple roles. The last Coffee with Dr. K event of the 2022-23 school year will take place from 4-5 p.m. on May 2 at the Downtown White Bear Lake Caribou Coffee. We'll be there, likely with a cup of decaf in-hand, ready to make a connection.

The partnerships we've been able to forge while spending time together over lunch have been instrumental in getting us to where we are today. Thank you to those who partner with us to positively impact the students' experiences, in both formal and informal ways. We look forward to continuing to find ways to learn together in partnership.

District receives finance awards for 22nd consecutive year

White Bear Lake Area Schools recently received the Government Finance Officers Association's (GFOA) Certificate of Achievement for Excellence in Financial Reporting. The district also recently received the Excellence in Financial Reporting Award from the Association of School Business Officials (ASBO). These two awards are the highest form of recognition a governmental agency can receive and represent a significant accomplishment for the finance department and its staff. This year's recognition marks the 22nd consecutive year the district has received both awards.

To be considered for the awards, the finance department submits its annual comprehensive financial report to be reviewed by an impartial panel at GFOA and ASBO. If the report meets all of the requirements, the district may qualify for the highest recognition. According to GFOA Director of Technical Services, Michele Mark Levine, the district's annual report demonstrates "a constructive 'spirit of full disclosure' to clearly communicate its financial story."

When discussing the award at the recent January School Board meeting, it was noted that these awards align with the District's high level of accountability. "The finance team continues to prioritize responsible stewardship of the resources provided by the community," said Superintendent Wayne Kazmierczak. "We are proud that district residents recently rated our financial management well above the industry norm, putting us in the top quarter of suburban districts."
