## Background Information



- School Board requested staff to review elementary school boundaries and propose adjustments after deciding not to proceed with the E10 campus.
- PUSD elementary schools enrollments are unbalanced
- Since the 2019/20 PUSD has seen a decline of enrollment of about 1000 students
- Enrollment is now projected to decline and flatten
- TK expansion and new planned housing



# **Guiding Principles**




- 1. The elementary school capacity (existing or with proposed new facilities) should be able to meet the projected enrollment for the next 5-7 years
- 2. Schools projected enrollments should be balanced using boundary adjustments and/or school programs (i.e language immersion) to the extent possible
- 3. The enrollments at the middle and high schools should be balanced to the extent allowed by the schools capacity (existing or with proposed new facilities)
- 4. School boundaries should enhance neighborhood schools and community engagement
- 5. School boundaries should support safe routes to schools, student safety and public transportation routes to the extent possible
- 6. School boundaries should promote socioeconomic diversity among the students and community to the extent possible
- 7. Boundary adjustment should include a transition plan that minimize the impacts to students and families

## Factors Affecting Boundary Decisions



- Demographic changes and the effect over time
- The City's Housing and Regional Housing Needs Assessment (RHNA):
  - City's Housing Element approval for January 26, 2023 (housing growth potential will be clearer)
- Specialized Programs Spanish Dual Immersion / Special Education
- School Size Factors: Existing capacity and physical school size
- Identify boundary constraints 680 fwy, drainage canals, etc.
- Transitional Kindergarten program expansion

### **Enrollment Projections**





- Enrollment has decreased in three consecutive years driven by:
  - Lower birth rates
  - Migration changes
  - COVID pandemic
  - Cost of living housing cost
- Projections include:
  - Growth from TK
  - New housing expected to be built during the study period





| General                                     | Many voiced support for making these long needed adjustments to reduce<br>the impact to Donlon and Fairlands and address the low resident students at<br>Mohr ES. |
| Housing at Santa Rita<br>and W. Las Positas | This area is currently 10 min walking distance to Fairlands. In some options it would go to Mohr ES making walking to that school more difficult.                 |
| Homes in the Sutter Gate<br>Ave Area        | Currently they attend Alisal. Some are concerned that going to Mohr will be more difficult and take longer.   |
| Del Prado Park Area                         | Generally supportive of moving this area to Walnut Grove as the neighborhood is geographically connected to Walnut Grove.   |
| Ruby Hills Area                             | Generally supportive of moving this area to Vintage Hills as many families currently transfer to that school and is geographically closer.                        |
| Laguna Oaks Area                            | Input received that this area would like to stay with Lydiksen ES as it is more connected to that neighborhood and ability to bike to school.                     |



| Property Value     | Some residents were concerned about the potential impact of these changes on their property value.  |
| Traffic concerns   | Variety of input and concerns on impact to traffic and walkability of the changes.  |

### Biking/Walking Considerations Proposed Boundary Path to Mohr ES #2 and #4

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

### Implementation Process/Timeline: TK/K



- For this year (2023-24), students enrolling in TK and K for the fall of 2023, will enroll in their current residential school
- The 2024-2025 new TK and K students will be assigned to their new residential school
- If the boundary change goes into effect prior to the 2023-2024 school year, individual families will be notified and offered to move to the new school of residence, based on the new boundary and space availability
- After July 1, 2023 families enrolling students new to PUSD will be assigned to their new residential boundary school

### Implementation Process/Timeline: GR 1-5

- ] Schievement artnerships Communication
- Students attending an elementary school in grades 1-5 may continue at that elementary school until Grade 5
- Younger siblings will be allowed to enroll in the same school as their older sibling(s)
- If the older sibling is no longer enrolled at the school site, the younger sibling would be enrolled in their new resident school
- A student that the district has overflowed to another school will have first priority to return to their resident school, if and when a seat opens

### Implementation Process/Timeline: 6-8



- Starting in 2024-2025, rising 6th grade students will be attend the middle school in the new boundary
- If families would like to attend their "old" boundary school, they may apply through the Open Enrollment process
- A student that the district has overflowed to another school will have first priority to return to their resident school, if and when a seat opens
- Sibling rule applies to the middle school changes
- Students continuing in the DLI program would matriculate through PMS and Foothill HS

### High School Boundaries

- Review boundaries during the 2023/24
- Consider changing choice areas



### **Current Elementary School Boundaries**




